NURSERY NEWS - Message from Mr Thomas

The Nursery continues to be a very busy place, with lots happening! The children and staff have loved welcoming Parents and Carers into the Nursery setting for the various events which have taken place.

DOES YOUR CHILD BRING A PACKED LUNCH TO NURSERY?

A number of our children bring a packed lunch to Nursery. We are noticing that an increasing number of them are coming to Nursery with packed lunch boxes filled with excess snacks. We obviously want to encourage the children to eat the lunches provided by our school kitchen, but we understand that the menu does not always appeal to every child.

If you are sending a packed lunch in to Nursery, please do try to ensure that there is a healthy balance and that there are not excessive amounts of sweets and treats!

Many of the sweets we are seeing have lots of additives and colouring in them. This does have an impact on behaviour within the Nursery!

Please try to remember the following:

- One sweet treat is enough.
- Keep packed lunches as health as possible.
- Snack is also provided within the Nursery, over and above the lunch on offer.
- Do not over fill your child's packed lunch





AS WE ARE NOW IN THE THROWS OF SUMMER...

Please ensure that you put Sun Screen on your child before they come to Nursery. Remember that, even if it is cloudy early in the morning, the sun can be splitting the trees by mid morning/afternoon. Our Scottish weather can be unpredictable! It can be sunny one minute and raining the next, so please try to plan ahead for all weathers!

NURSERY TO P1 TRANSITION

Our pre-school children had two very successful visits to school to, when they met their teachers, met some new friends and were supported by their buddies.

Buddies have also been able to visit the children who attend our own Nursery Class and Laburnum Family Learning Centre. Class Teachers have visited all of our partner Nurseries to see the

DRAMA CLUB SUMMER PRODUCTION & CHOIR RECITAL


The children and staff of the Drama Club have been working very hard during rehearsals and are looking forward to their performance of **When You Wish Upon a Star!**

EARLY COLLECTION BEFORE 3PM

I have previously appealed to our Parents and Carers regarding the number of children who are collected before 3pm.

On a daily basis children are collected from as early as 2:20pm.

Early collection should only take place when it is absolutely necessary!

When you collect your child early it impacts upon the entire school. Children are tannoyed which interrupts Learning and Teaching. The end of the day is just as important as the start. Classes review their learning, are finishing off tasks and setting homework. Classes prepare for the events of the following day.

Going forward, I would ask for your co-operation and consideration:

- Avoid early collection if at all possible.
- Only collect your child if another arrangement is not possible.
- Call the school in advance so that we can assist and have your child ready and their teacher is aware. This can also reduce the calls over the Tannoy!

LATE ARRIVAL IN THE MORNING

Arriving late in the morning is something which is becoming more of a problem in school. We have a steady stream of children arriving late and this can be up to 10am or later! Even being 5 or 10 minutes late is disruptive.

School starts at **9am.** We have a soft start in the morning where children can come into the building from **8:50am.** This allows children to settle and get themselves ready for the day ahead.


If your child is regularly late, please try and work with us to reduce this. Being on time for school means:

- Children do not miss the start of the day and the morning routine which includes registering, ordering lunch, talking through the timetable for the day and setting the tone for the day.
- Less disruption to the rest of the class.
- The Teacher does not need to stop teaching a lesson which has already begun.
- Your own child doesn't feel any pressure when arriving late.

We know that there will be occasions when exceptions have to be made! We know life gets in the way and late arrivals or early collections need to happen. We just don't want this to be the norm! Lets work together to maximise school attendance. Please contact Mr Thomas if you have concerns about your child's attendance.

Thanks to Mrs MacFadyen for her work to organise the week for our children and staff.


TOYS & FOOTBALLS

Can I please remind our children and all parents/carers that toys should not be brought into school, even on a Friday for Golden Time. The only reason a toy should be brought into school is if the Teacher has requested this for reasons to support the curriculum.

THE SCHOOL HAS A SUFFICIENT SUPPLY OF FOOTBALLS. Children should not bring their personal footballs to school. This can cause issues on the pitch. If we use school footballs, then there is no issue over who a football belongs to. New footballs have recently been purchased.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Please remember that the expectation is that **ALL CHILDREN** wear school uniform when they attend school. Garments which are NOT uniform are creeping in... in every class!

We ask that all children wear their school tie. The reality is that, when they attend secondary school, they must wear a tie without exception! Therefore, the more they wear it at primary school, the easier it will be for them in the future.

Please make every effort to send your child to school in school uniform. If you need support with this, please get in touch and we can help you with uniform.

WHAT TO WEAR OR NOT TO WEAR FOR PE!

Whilst we do not ask children to change into their PE kit in school these days, we do ask that they wear a kit that is appropriate.

The most appropriate kit is:

Black tracksuit bottoms/shorts, school polo shirt, school sweatshirt, trainers.

FOOTBALL STRIPS ARE NOT PERMITTED. This includes ALL football strips or track suits. More and more children are wearing football related garments and this has never been permitted. Please do not send your child to school with ANY football items - including bags and other accessories.

PREPARING TO BUY UNIFORM FOR NEXT YEAR...

The start of a new school year is a very good time to get back into routine and the wearing of full school uniform! Many of our children do this, but it can slip at times. I have already outlined what the requested uniform is, as well as the accepted PE kit.

DAILY SCHOOL UNIFORM:

- Light Blue Shirt
- School tie
- Black trousers/skirt/pinafore
- Plain Black Shoes/Trainers
- Royal Blue Sweater/Cardigan/Top
- School Fleece/Blazer/Jacket & embroidered garments are OPTIONAL.

PE KIT:

- Light Blue Polo
- School Sweater/Cardigan/Top
- Plain black Trainers

Keeping everyone dressed in this way, keeps a sense of uniform and it means that you are buying things which can be worn on other days at school!

TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE END OF TERM

Our school has an agreed Transition Policy for children who are moving from stage to stage within our school (for example, P1 to P2, etc.) This allows us to prepare children for the changes they are about to experience. It also lets them spend time with their new Class Teacher before the end of the school year. This is particularly important for children with an identified need, but it is important for all of our children! It is a valuable exercise for our staff too.

We offer a **UNIVERSAL TRANSITION PROGRAMME** to all children. This involves two 'Meet the Teacher' sessions. These will take place on:

Wednesday 21st June 2023 at 9:15am and Monday 26th June 2023 at 1:45pm

Please try to ensure your child is in attendance for these events.

We also offer an **ENHANCED TRANSITION EXPERIENCE** for those children who will perhaps find the experience more challenging. This will involve some individual time for children with their new Teacher. It will also involve a more specific information sharing process between Teachers. There is also extensive information shared between Teachers in order to support our children in their next steps.

END OF YEAR MASS

We will have our final Mass of the school year on **Wednesday 28th June at 10am in St. Columba's**. This Mass is special for a number of reasons and we take the opportunity to mark a couple of events.

PRESENTATION OF P7 TIES TO P6 PUPILS

At the end of this Mass, our P6 children who are making the move into P7 in August will be presented with their special P7 Ties. This marks the moment these children are handed the leadership of the school from our outgoing P7 cohort.

PRESENTATION OF THE POPE FRANCIS FAITH AWARD TO P7 PUPILS

Some of our P7 children have come to the end of their Pope Francis Faith Award and they are presented with their framed certificates and a small gift from the Scottish Catholic Education Service.

All Parents/Carers and family members are invited to join us for this Mass. A special invitation goes to our P6 and P7 families. We hope to see many of you there!

THANK YOU TO MISS MCDONALD & WELCOME TO MRS MCGHEE

As you know, we have had a vacancy within our Breakfast Club since Mrs Cummings was appointed as a full time clerical assistant. Since then, Miss McDonald has been looking after the children in the Breakfast Club. This was initially only supposed to be for a short period, however, there were a few delays in making a permanent

appointment. I wish to thank Miss McDonald for supporting us and for looking after the Breakfast Club over the last months.

I have pleasure in welcoming Mrs McGhee who has taken up the posts of Breakfast Club Assistant and also as Dining Hall Assistant.

Mrs McGhee also supports our children at lunch time. We are delighted to welcome Miss McGhee to our staff team and we hope that she quickly feels part of the St. John Paul II family! Mrs

McGhee has previous experience, which she is already putting to good use!



ENCOURAGING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR, POSITIVE ATTITUDES AND WORKING HARD TO THE END OF TERM...

As we approach the end of term, we always find that the children can begin to flag a little. They are tired and have the summer holidays in sight!

The message from us in school is that we still have a lot to do! Lots of learning and lots of fun events coming our way.

We are encouraging the children to continue to show RESPECT for themselves, to others and to property and the environment around them.

The hot weather can bring different challenges! When children are hot, they need some water to refresh them. Please try to send in a bottle which can be refilled. I realise that some children do not like water. A small amount of diluting juice in their water is perfectly acceptable. **No fizzy drinks, energy drinks or drinks filled with additives should be sent into school!**

Finally, the end of term can bring some extra squabbles in the playground! We always try to deal with issues promptly and fairly. Please encourage your child(ren) to play sensibly and gently!

BOOK ANMESTY

If you have any school books at home, please do try to return them before the end of term. This allows us to get a true 'stock level' before we start to order new resources.

Books which belong to the school will have a school stamp on the inside cover. The infant reading books are particularly recognisable! Please support our efforts. Replacing books is like everything else these days... very expensive!

Thank you for your support with this.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

We have ordered new furniture so that we can reinstate our school library. This will cost us around £5000 for the furniture. We have a good stock of library books, but we will be looking to increase these in the future. We are also planning to:

- Apply for a grant for Library Resources.
- Source a digital solution for cataloguing our library books so that children can scan them in and out.
- Set up a small group to run the Library.
- Run some book clubs and other events to raise the profile of reading for enjoyment with our children and families.
