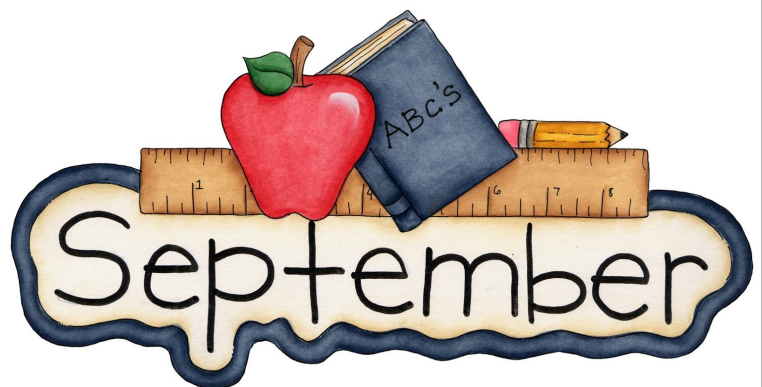

The start of a school year always means I need to send out some reminders about various routines and expectations for our Parents, Carers and others who help you with the school run!

These routines help with the safe, smooth and successful running of our school. It is only with the co-operation of **everyone** that our school operates in those ways.

Maybe not all of these reminders will be relevant to you, but they are relevant to others. **Something** will be relevant to everyone!

If people ignore these and think these reminders are not for them, then this can lead to discontent with other Parents/Carers and it can also lead to otherwise avoidable situations.

I don't send these out to you all in order to complain! I send them in the hope that everyone will recognise that it takes a team effort to create a positive ethos in our school.

HEADLICE & TREATMENT

Head lice are tiny insects that live in hair. Nits are the empty egg cases attached to hair that head lice hatch from. Head lice are a common problem, particularly in school children aged 4 to 11. They're largely harmless, but can live in the hair for a long time if not treated and can be irritating and frustrating to deal with. Please click [NHS Inform](#) for information about Headlice and how to prevent/treat it. **Children with long hair should have this tied back at ALL TIMES.** Staying off work or school and washing clothing and bedding on a hot wash is unnecessary, as it's unlikely to help prevent the spread of head lice.

NUT ALLERGIES

We have a number of children and some staff who have **severe nut allergies**. It is important to make all Parents/Carers and Children aware of the dangers of bringing items which contain nuts in them to school. You may think that it is only when a person comes into direct contact with nuts that they can be affected. However, people can take a reaction even by touching the hand of someone who has come into contact with nuts. Therefore, we ask that you send nothing into school with your child which contains nuts. This includes Chocolate Spread, and in **particular Nutella**.



CAR PARK ATTITUDES & BEHAVIOURS

The Car Park has been the focus of some recent communications to all Parents/Carers. Despite consistent reminders and appeals, the Car Park still feels like an accident waiting to happen. Please, please, PLEASE... if you or another member of your family is a driver and you enter either of our Car Parks to drop off or collect children, **be safe, be sensible and be courteous**. Drive with care, follow the one way system, park in a safe space and be on the look out for pedestrians.

PLEASE DO NOT BRING DOGS INTO THE SCHOOL GROUNDS!

At the beginning of a new school year, it seems that lots of people have forgotten that absolutely **NO DOGS** are permitted to be in the school grounds, regardless of size, age or breed. Carrying dogs in the school grounds is also not permitted. I ask for your co-operation with this matter, as we currently have a number of people bringing dogs when dropping off and collecting children. This is particularly concerning during busy times. **At one point in the last two weeks, we had 4 dogs in the grounds at the same time!** It is preferable that dogs are not even brought near the school gates. The areas immediately outside the gates are also busy and can cause dogs to become distressed and agitated. This is particularly concerning when there is more than one dog in the area at the same time.



HAVE YOU LABELLED YOUR CHILD'S BELONGINGS?

The lost property mountain is rising from the ashes again! Despite repeated calls for all items to be labelled, we find numerous items every day with no name and no way of returning them to their owners. **It is so sad to see these garments and other belongings going unclaimed.** Please help us! We will lay these out for you to reclaim in the coming days.



DOES YOUR CHILD BRING A WATER BOTTLE TO SCHOOL? NO ENERGY OR FIZZY DRINKS IN SCHOOL!

We encourage our children to remain hydrated throughout the day and there are a number of water coolers throughout the school. Water is the preferred option for a drink in the classroom, however, a small amount of diluting juice would be acceptable, if children are unable to drink water. **Under no circumstances should children bring energy drinks or cans/bottles of fizzy juice to school.** There is scientific evidence to suggest that these drinks have a negative impact on our children's health and, importantly in school, their **BEHAVIOUR!**

PLEASE LEAVE TOYS, CARDS & OWN FOOTBALLS AT HOME

As with previous years, we ask that children do not bring toys and cards into school. It's not that we want to spoil any fun, but that they can, and do cause problems in the classroom, in the playground and in the dining room. We have plenty of fun things for the children to play with at school and we provide an ample supply of footballs for the football pitch. We aim to reduce fall outs and to ensure property is not lost or damaged. **TOYS SHOULD ONLY BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL IF IT IS RELATED TO LEARNING AND IS REQUESTED BY THE CLASS TEACHER.** Please ensure that your child does not bring their swapping cards to school as we are having increasing issues with these.

ATTENDANCE, LATE ARRIVAL AND EARLY COLLECTION

Attendance at school is very, very important to a child's development. This is true, not only of their academic progress, but their overall development socially, mentally and physically. The target for every child should be 100% attendance, but we know that this is not possible for a number of reasons.

IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL:

- Please contact the school to report this absence ASAP, either by phone, email or through the absence reporting option on **PARENT PORTAL**.
- Not reporting an absence will mean that your child's absence is marked as **Unexplained**.

THE NORTH LANARKSHIRE TARGET FOR ATTENDANCE IS 95%.

LATE ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL IS DISRUPTIVE FOR EVERYONE! Please aim to have your child in school by 9am each day, if not before.

EARLY COLLECTION OF CHILDREN BEFORE 3PM IS AN ONGOING PROBLEM. It is also disruptive to everyone! Please only collect your child early if it is absolutely necessary and not simply to beat the traffic or avoid the busy car park.

PARENTS NIGHT APPOINTMENTS

As previously mentioned, we will have our first Parent/Carer appointments on **Thursday 12th October 2023**. Appointments can be made through the online booking system.

Whilst our office staff are more than willing to help if you have a problem booking, I ask that you make every effort to make your own appointment via the online portal before making contact with the school for help.

PARENTS PORTAL

As you know, we are encouraging our Parents/Carers to get involved in signing up for Parents Portal. This is the one stop digital portal for everything regarding school... reports, absence, permission slips, etc.

We know that many of you are having problems linking your account to your child or children. We are seeking support from NLC and also Parents Portal and will be in touch when we have a solution. This is the very thing which puts people off of going digital! We hope to have this sorted ASAP and to then offer support sessions to get everyone up and running. Thank you for your patience.

HOLIDAY WEEKEND - NON UNIFORM DAY

You will see that Friday 22nd September and Monday 25th September are holidays. Our tradition is that we have a NON UNIFORM DAY on the Thursday before. This will be held on Thursday 21st September. Children can come to school without uniform. However, **NO FOOTBALL STRIPS** should be worn, as per North Lanarkshire Council regulations.

We will gratefully receive donations for Non Uniform days (usually around £1 per child). However, all children can take part, regardless if they make a donation. Money will go to school funds to support activities/treats for the children.

MRS BRADLEY IS RETIRING

The vast majority of our Parents/Carers will know Mrs Bradley, who is our Classroom Assistant. Mrs Bradley has been a valued member of our staff team since St. John Paul II Primary School opened in May 2006. Please make every effort to attend the relevant meeting, as this is your opportunity to enrol your child for the preparation programme. Children need not attend, but can do so if you have an issue with child care.

We have a collection of First Communion Dresses which are available for anyone to have for free. We also have brand new shoes and some other accessories. You are welcome to pop in and take a look at any time!

FEAST OF ST. JOHN PAUL II

This year, our official Patronal Feast Day falls at the end of the October Holiday. We will therefore celebrate our Patronal Feast Day on **Monday 23rd October**.

We will have our Feast Day Mass at 11am in the Assembly Hall. Everyone is welcome to attend this!

We will also have a Cinema afternoon as a treat and we will provide the children with a snack for this.

Uniform should be worn as normal. There is no charge for the Cinema afternoon.

HOUSE CAPTAINS & VICE CAPTAINS

We recently held elections for House Captain and Vice Captain for all five of our school houses. All children and staff are assigned to a house and throughout the year, house tokens are awarded. Each week, the tokens are added up and totals are announced at assembly. Those weekly totals are added to running totals for each house and, at the end of the school year, the winning house is awarded a special treat! Last year's winning house was Knock and they went along to The Vue Cinema for a private film viewing.

To earn house tokens, children are encouraged to follow our school values and our **All About Respect** motto. At St. John Paul II, we show respect to ourselves, others and property.

At the beginning of the school year, we revisit these approaches so that everyone is clear on the expectations placed upon them. We want to set high standards of behaviour, work ethic, effort and attitude in order to create a positive ethos with positive relationships.

WHERE DO THE NAMES OF OUR HOUSES COME FROM?

Our houses are all names after places of Pilgrimage associated with Our Lady. The reason for this stems from the large M that you will see on our school badge. Our badge is similar to the coat of arms of St. John Paul II when he was Pope. The M highlights his devotion to Mary, the Mother of Jesus.



SCHOOL MEALS FOR P6 & P7 ARE NOT FREE FOR NOW.

The Scottish Government has paused the roll out of Free School Meals for children in P6 and P7. This means that Breakfast Club and Lunches must be paid for, unless you have applied for and are in receipt of Free School Meals for your child.

If you think your child qualifies for Free School Meals because of your income, then you should apply by completing the form. If you do not apply, then you will be required to pay **£3.10** per day and there will also be a charge for the Breakfast Club. The charge for Breakfast Club is incremental, starting at £1 for one child.

P.E. UNIFORM



*We are having a big push on the wearing of **PE Uniform**. Lots of information has been sent out about this towards the end of June, during the holidays and before the beginning of the new school year. We want to discourage children from coming to school on PE days dressed as though it is another non-uniform day! It is not good for their work ethic or the ethos of the school and it also places unnecessary pressure upon families to be providing expensive gear to wear to school!*

*If you stick with the suggested **PE Uniform**, then your child is dressed for a day at school! There are plenty of opportunities for children to dress down on fun days, non-uniform days, parties and Halloween.*

PE UNIFORM IS:

Plain black jogging bottoms/leggings/shorts, pale blue school polo shirt, royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan. It's up to you if you want the badge to be on any of these garments.

*Some children are coming to school wearing school hoodies. This is a privilege reserved for P7 as a leavers' treat! **Please note that HOODIES are not part of school uniform**, but could perhaps be worn on PE days, if they are school colours (royal blue) and you have already made the purchase. However, they should not be worn out with PE days and preferably not at all.*
