Over the next two years, the children will work hard with Miss Williamson and Miss Byrne on a number of tasks and activities. This journey encourages the children to put the Gifts of the Holy Spirit into action in their lives. We look forward to sharing aspects of their journey with you all!

#### **MORNING GATHERING**

In recent weeks we have been trying a new approach to starting each school day together. We have set up a temporary sound system in the main corridor. Each morning, just after the bell, Mr Thomas greets the children. We have a short time of morning prayer together (just as the children would do every day with their Class Teachers) and we set the tone for the day ahead. It is an ideal opportunity to share information, make any announcements and give messages of encouragement for attitude/behaviour/mindset/ work. The children and staff are enjoying this new approach and so, we are looking at installing a permanent sound system that we can use. This will also allow us to have larger sessions together in just the infant or junior/senior departments.

#### SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION PROGRAMME 2023 - 24

Many thanks to those Parents/Carers who were able to come along to the Enrolment Meetings hosted by our two parishes back in September. We held these earlier than usual so that we could give you dates earlier. These were issued at the meetings. time.


St. Gabriel's will take place during the school day,

#### IT'S GETTING COLDER OUT THERE!

#### **CHRISTMAS PARTIES**

Our Christmas Parties are always a highlight for the children. Here are the dates (giving you plenty of notice) so that you can plan ahead, plus some other general information.

- Children should attend in the morning (in school uniform) as normal.
