#### **VISIT FROM NLC HEALTH & SAFETY INSPECTOR**

Many thanks to those of you have tried to respond favourably to my recent letter regarding Health and Safety in the School Car Park. I have noticed some improvement, but things still remain concerning. In the space of a couple of days, I have witnessed a couple of near misses involving vehicles and pedestrians.

As I mentioned in the letter, I invited a member of the NLC Health and Safety Team to come and view the Car Park at the end of the school day. It was an interesting experience for me to witness his response to what he saw. When I asked him how many near misses he witnessed in the space of about 20 minutes, he said, "Too many to count!" In one way, I was glad that he experienced things as he did, however, his hi-viz vest made some people think twice and so, the Car Park was not as bad as it usually is!


He has gone away to write up some suggestions for us to consider and this may or may not help us to find a way forward which ensures the safety of our children and other people.

One thing he did mention was children walking on the road to get to their Parents/Carers who are waiting in cars. Children are moving in and out of a space where vehicles are moving and, in particular, reversing. With the best will in the world, can you be guaranteed to see a small child in your rear view mirror before reversing? *Perhaps we everyone should reverse INTO a space so that they are facing OUT which makes it easier to see.* 

I will share the outcome of the Health and Safety visit as soon as I can. In the meantime, I encourage you all to consider how YOU can contribute to a safer Car Park.

#### **LENTEN CHARITY FUN DAY**

On the last day of term, Thursday 28th March, we will have our Lenten Charity Fun Day. This is always a great way to end the term. The children will have lots of fun activities and competitions to get involved in and we will raise some much needed funds for our chosen charities as well as school funds.

#### **MUDDY PLAGROUND**

I have no doubt that most of you, if not all of you, will be aware that there are areas within the school grounds which are very muddy, especially in the winter. We have a steady stream of children at the office during intervals because they have been in the mud. Sometimes, this is accidental and other times, the children have simply been having fun and have not noticed that they are on the grass and in the mud.

I guess that I am writing to you all to firstly apologise for this! It is not something which I can control, per say, but it is something we try to talk to the children about, encouraging them to stay off the grass during wet periods. The school is surrounded by grass verges, which the children are obviously attracted to! There are also large grassy areas in the infant playground and our infant children are the ones who get the most muddy! I cannot really offer a solution, but I wanted you all to know that we do try and cope with this issue as best we can. It is not easy, and with hundreds of children in the same space, it is an ongoing problem! If only we could change them all into full waterproof gear on a wet/muddy day!

#### PRIMARY 7 VISIT TO STRATHCLYDE PARK - 22nd to 26th APRIL 2024

The Primary 7 children will attend their week of outdoor learning and activities from 22nd April - 26th April 2024. The children are looking forward to this and the groups who have gone from our school in previous years have thoroughly enjoyed their time! I am sure that this year will be no different. We pray for good weather!

#### **PAYMENT**

As the date draws closer, I remind Parents/Carers that, although the total cost is £120, you need only pay £90. The Parent Council have subsidised the trip by £20 and the school is cover £10 per child. This can be paid online using, or money can be sent into school. Online payments are preferable.

Payments can be made in installments, as and when you are able.

If there is anyone who is concerned about paying the full amount, please let Mr Thomas know. We can offer support.

#### Important Information:

- Pupils are required to bring a packed lunch for lunch time, a snack and drink for morning break.
- **No valuable items such as phones should come to the park**. There is no safe place to store them. If a pupil does bring a valuable item, such as a phone, it is at their own risk.
- The pupils will be outdoors most of the time at the park so should come dressed appropriately according to the weather see equipment checklist (Please check weather forecast each day).
- **Boats** Your child will take part in boats activities on the water of Strathclyde Park Loch and in the Scottish rowing centre at Strathclyde Park. The pupils will be given a thorough briefing on water safety, rules for when on the boats and a life vest. The life vest will be fitted by NLC staff only. Please be aware, that there is always a safety boat out on the water during the boats activities.
- **Cycling** If your child is a non-cyclist or not confident, we will work with them to increase their confidence throughout the week. We supply the bikes & helmets.
- Transport Pupils are picked up by a bus at 9am from the school and returned to the school for 3pm.

#### Kit List (Depending on season) – some of this will be provided as indicated below.

- Spare socks
- Waterproofs Jacket & Trousers (We have spares if the pupil does not own these)
- Full change of clothes
- Plenty of water
- Packed Lunch (school lunch provided to those entitled to Free School Meals)
- Healthy snacks for morning break
- Warm clothing (Gloves, hat, scarf, layers if possible season dependant!)
- Suncream
- Own helmet if they wish & cycling gloves if they have these
- Change of shoes/wellies (We have spare wellies if pupil does not own these)
- Hand towel

#### Items on the above list will be required EACH DAY.

If you have any questions, please do get in touch and we will answer any questions you might have, or find out the answer for you if we don't already know it!

The children will have a ball throughout the week! It is really something to look forward to.

# P.E. UNIFORM



We are having a big push on the wearing of **PE Uniform**. Lots of information has been sent out about this towards the end of June, during the holidays and before the beginning of the new school year. We want to discourage children from coming to school on PE days dressed as though it is another non-uniform day! It is not good for their work ethic or the ethos of the school and it also places unnecessary pressure upon families to be providing expensive gear to wear to school!

If you stick with the suggested **PE Uniform**, then your child is dressed for a day at school! There are plenty of opportunities for children to dress down on fun days, non-uniform days, parties and Halloween.

#### PE UNIFORM IS:

Plain black jogging bottoms/leggings/shorts, pale blue school polo shirt, royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan. It's up to you if you want the badge to be on any of these garments.

Some children are coming to school wearing school hoodies. <u>This is a privilege reserved for P7 as a leavers' treat!</u> **Please note that HOODIES are not part of school uniform**, but could perhaps be worn on PE days, if they are school colours (royal blue) and you have already made the purchase.



#### SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR


We received some feedback after our last Parents' Night with a number of you asking why we didn't have the Book Fair anymore.

Emailing Parents/Carers from our system is FREE. If you are on Parent Portal, you can update your





#### P6 & P7 UNPAID SCHOOL MEALS

I have been asked by North Lanarkshire to remind you that Universal Free School Meals are not currently available for P6 and P7 children. For now, children need to pay for their meals, **unless you have applied for Free School Meals.** You can do this by clicking <u>HERE</u>. You can apply for a Clothing Grant at the same place. It is not too late to apply and you can apply at any time!

If your child attends Breakfast Club, they must also pay for their breakfast.

If you are worried or concerned about a school meal debt, or you feel that you are unable to pay for this, please contact Mr Thomas. There are ways in which we can help in this situation, but it would be better to make contact, rather than continue to let the amounts increase on your child's account.


#### **PARENTS PORTAL**


