A Parents Portal account allows you to:

- make online payments for school lunch, trips and visits.
- report your child's absence, without having to call the school
- complete the annual data check online
- update your contact preference details online
- electronically sign permission slips
- book your parent's evening appointment
- access your child's pupil report online



Please note that when creating an account the information you use for your Parent Portal account must match the information held in the school system.



SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT UPDATE

This year's School Improvement Priorities have progressed in the following ways:

Cluster Priority 1: Keeping The Promise

- The Promise is a Scottish Government initiative, whereby a promise is made to care experienced children and young people that they will grow up loved, safe and respected.
- Our cluster schools have set up a Working Group to ensure that the we are engaging with The Promise within our establishments.
- Staff have been given Keeping The Promise Training and have engaged with the resources on their website.

Cluster Priority 2: Pupil Attendance

- We have increased communication with Parents/Carers around attendance and latecoming.
- It is worth noting that our attendance has generally worsened, as has latecoming. There is also an increase in the number of children being collected from school early.
- The Cluster Schools have developed a Dashboard which is updated monthly with data and statistics. This helps us focus on children and families where we have concerns.


Both of these priorities will be included in next year's Improvement Plan.

School Priority 1: Talk for Writing

- This is our second year of development within Talk for Writing and we are really seeing an increase in engagement from the children!
- More staff have received the full training.
- We have extended our approaches to include Non-Fiction Writing.
- We have developed our approaches to planning this area of the curriculum.

School Priority 2: Curriculum Content and Rationale

- We successfully evaluated and reviewed our Vision, Mission and Values and these have been shared with the school community.
- We have reviewed the provision of Literacy and Numeracy and have agreed expectations for Learning and Teaching at all stages within the school.
- We have begun to review our entire curriculum offering, taking into consider the Four Contexts of Learning. These are the Curricular Areas & Subjects, Interdisciplinary Learning, Ethos & Life of the School and Opportunities for Personal Achievement.





PLANNING FOR SESSION 2024-25

The Cluster have decided to keep both of the current priorities for next session, building upon the work which has already been done. North Lanarkshire have produced and new Pupil Attendance Policy, which will contribute to the existing work being done.

We will publish full details of our Annual Improvement Priorities at the beginning of the next school year.

EVERY DAY COUNTS!

IT'S NOT ONLY ATTENDANCE THAT COUNTS! GOOD TIME KEEPING AT ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL TIMES COUNTS JUST AS MUCH!

As you know, we have had a focus on Attendance through our Annual Improvement Plan. We have serious concerns about attendance, late coming and early collection! These are increasing in our school! We need to work together to change this trend.

A child who is late or absent is NEVER punished and we take great care to ensure our children are warmly welcomed, regardless of their attendance issues. In fact, it is perhaps more important that a child who is missing school feels secure, welcomed, valued and loved in our school! This is what makes a child want to return. Look out for more about this in the new school year. If you know your child's attendance is concerning, approach us so that we can help to make improvements.

PREPARING TO BUY UNIFORM FOR NEXT YEAR...

The start of a new school year is a very good time to get back into routine and the wearing of full school uniform! Many of our children do this, but it can slip at times. I have already outlined what the requested uniform is, as well as the accepted PE kit.

DAILY SCHOOL UNIFORM:

- Light Blue Shirt
- School tie
- Black trousers/skirt/pinafore
- Plain Black Shoes/Trainers
- Royal Blue Sweater/Cardigan/Top
- School Fleece/Blazer/Jacket & embroidered garments are OPTIONAL.

PE KIT:

- Light Blue Polo
- School Sweater/Cardigan/Top
- Plain black Trainers

Keeping everyone dressed in this way, keeps a sense of uniform and it means that you are buying things which can be worn on other days at school!

TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE END OF TERM

Our school has an agreed Transition Policy for children who are moving from stage to stage within our school (for example, P1 to P2, etc.) This allows us to prepare children for the changes they are about to experience. It also lets them spend time with their new Class Teacher before the end of the school year. This is particularly important for children with an identified need, but it is important for all of our children! It is a valuable exercise for our staff too.

We offer a **UNIVERSAL TRANSITION PROGRAMME** to all children. This involves two 'Meet the Teacher' sessions. These will take place on:

Wednesday 12th June at 9:45am and Wednesday 19th June at 9:45am Please try to ensure your child is in attendance for these events.

We also offer an **ENHANCED TRANSITION EXPERIENCE** for those children who will perhaps find the experience more challenging. This will involve some individual time for children with their new Teacher. It will also involve a more specific information sharing process between Teachers. There is also extensive information shared between Teachers in order to support our children in their next steps.

PRIMARY 7 - LAST DAY ARRANGEMENTS

I am aware that various limos/buses, etc. may have been booked to help our P7 children celebrate their last day at Primary School. I would remind those who are responsible for organising these of the following:

- School finishes at 1pm. P7 will walk out just after 1pm (to allow the crowds to clear a little) and staff will form a guard of honour for them as they exit the main double gates at the infant playground.
- No hired vehicles should enter school grounds, including the car park.
- It would be best if the vehicles did not turn up until about 1:10pm when the area will have cleared a little.

LAST DAY OF TERM - ARRANGEMENTS FOR ALL

- The last day of term is Wednesday 26th June 2024.
- Breakfast Club from 8:15am as normal.
- Mass at 10am in St. Columba's Church.
 All welcome to join us.
- We will have an early lunch served when we arrive back from Mass.
- The school kitchen will only be serving Snacks to Go on the last day. These will be order the day before (Tuesday 25th).
- School will close at 1pm for the Summer Holiday.

END OF YEAR MASS

We will have our final Mass of the school year on **Wednesday 26th June at 10am in St. Columba's**. This Mass is special for a number of reasons and we take the opportunity to mark a couple of events.

At the end of this Mass, our P6 children who are making the move into P7 in August will be presented with their special P7 Ties.

At the end of the school year, we will say farewell to some of our school and nursery staff. We hope to make presentations to them at the end of Mass.

All Parents/Carers and family members are invited to join us for this Mass. A special invitation goes to our P6 and P7 families. We hope to see many of you there!

SCHOOL UNIFORM SWAP SHOP

On Thursday 13th June, we will have all of the unclaimed school uniform laid out for a Uniform Swap Shop. You can bring along unwanted garments (please make sure that they are washed) and you can swap them for other garments which have been left in school and are unclaimed.

AS YOU KNOW, WE TRY TO RETURN ANY GRAMENTS WHICH HAVE NAMES ON

THEM. However, many garments have no name at all, despite our numerous appeals throughout the year.

Please make use of this opportunity to swap uniform. Please also ensure you label all of your child's belongings! Thank you!

BOOK ANMESTY

If you have any school books at home, please do try to return them before the end of term. This allows us to get a true 'stock level' before we start to order new resources.

Books which belong to the school will have a school stamp on the inside cover. The infant

reading books are particularly recognisable! Please support our efforts. Replacing books is like everything else these days... very expensive! Thank you for your support with this.
