#### IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL:

- Please contact the school to report this absence ASAP, either by phone, email or through the absence reporting option on **PARENT PORTAL.**
- Not reporting an absence will mean that your child's absence is marked as Unexplained.

#### I MENTIONED EARLY COLLECTION AT OUR P4-7 PARENTS AS PARTNERS EVENTS RECENTLY!

This is a HUGE problem in our school and I appealed to those Parents/Carers who attended the events to work with us to reduce this. You can see that there were 125 occasions during the week of 11th—15th November 2024. That's not 125 children! The number of children would be higher, because many times there are multiple children in a

family. We have continued to monitor the number of children being removed from school before the 3pm bell. The odd occasion is acceptable. Habitual early collection is not so acceptable and the children and teachers are being impacted upon because of this disruption.


The picture is improving and so I thank you for that! However, it is by no means at an acceptable level!


#### Pilgrims of Hope



- Our Pope Francis Faith Award children work hard to put into action the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and they try to inspire others to do the same.







#### **PUMA ONLINE ASSESSMENTS**



Children in P1 have recently taken part in a written numeracy assessment. P2—P7 are also taking part, but theirs is an online version.

This is the second year we are using this kind of assessment and it is used as a diagnostic tool to help us identify gaps in learning.

There has been a significant financial investment in this and the system also gives Teachers suggested areas to revise and revisit.

We use a suite of assessment in Literacy and Numeracy. We generally do not report back on specific scores, etc. These just contribute to the Teachers' Professional Judgement on pupil progress. If assessments flag up major concerns, we would contact families. Equally, if we feel support is required, we would aim to put this in place and also contact families.
