SCHOOL UNIFORM MATTERS

We have a high percentage of children who wear school uniform every day. This includes on PE days! However, more recently, there has been an increase in children wearing items that are not school uniform. I am including this reminder in our Newsletter in the hope that we can return to 100% uniform in the coming weeks.

OUR UNIFORM CONSISTS OF:

- Pale Blue Shirt/Blouse
- School Tie (P7 have their own ties)
- Black Trousers/Skirt/Pinafore
- Royal Blue School Sweatshirt/Cardigan/Top/ Fleece
- Black shoes
- Items do not need to be branded with the school badge. This helps to keep costs down.

ON PE DAYS, WE WEAR PE UNIFORM!

This should include:

- Black shorts/track suit bottoms (weather dependent)
- Pale Blue School Polo Shirt
- School Sweatshirt or Cardigan
- No branded sports gear!

Why PE uniform? Because PE is only for one block of the day. The rest of the day is for routine lessons.

WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD NOT WEAR TO SCHOOL?

- Items that are not school uniform
- Make up
- Hoop or dangly ear rings
- Fake nails

WEARING EXPENSIVE ITEMS

If you send your child to school wearing an item that is very expensive, you do so at your own risk. Very often expensive jackets spend a lot of time lying on the playground, on the pitch or on the floor of the cloakroom! Our children are very prone to removing jackets whilst outside when they are running about.

MAKE YOUR CHILD'S BELONGINGS IDENTIFIABLE

We always try to return items with names on them. Please try to make your child's clothing and other belongings easily identifiable with their name clearly on them.

PRIMARY 7 UNIFORM

For our Primary 7 children, it is **even more important** that they are in the habit of being in
full school uniform every day. As they prepare
to go to Cardinal Newman (or another chosen
High School) the expectation there will be that
they not only wear shirt and tie, but a blazer
also!

At the end of P6, I presented every child going into P7 with a special P7 tie. I have since given a number of children a replacement tie. This is a costly exercise, but one which is worthwhile.

As senior pupils in our school and the current leaders, we expect our P7s to set an example to the younger children. Leading by example is something that they can do in terms of wearing uniform. If a P7 child requires a new P7 tie, they can ask for one at any time. If they require new shirts, we can also provide these.

P7 LEAVERS' HOODIES

Leavers' Hoodies have become a tradition, but they are also a privilege. They are worn as **part of our school uniform.** The expectation is that a shirt and tie is worn underneath the hoodie. More information about these will be issued in due course.

MAKE UP, FALSE LASHES AND FALSE NAILS

An increasing number of girls (particularly in P7) are coming to school wearing make up. This has been building up in recent weeks. Children also wear false eye lashes and false nails to school. Whilst I understand that this may be for a special family occasion, it is not appropriate at any time for school.

In terms of nails, these are particularly dangerous in the playground and during PE. They can also be restrictive when holding a pen/pencil.

Earrings should also be studs and not hoops or dangling!

I know that this can be a sensitive issue and we want to avoid any upset, so would appreciate the support of Parents/Carers.



MESSAGE FROM MR THOMAS

Our Nursery continues to be a busy wee place, with lots of fun, laughter and learning going on every day. We had a recent visit from our North Lanarkshire Council Quality Officer, and this went very well. She was very impressed with our staff and with our children. LEARNING CONTEXT


Talk for Writing

Talk for Writing is an approach to developing skills for writing, linked to stories/books/texts. Our current text is **The Penguin Huddle** and the children are thoroughly enjoying this story! It is allowing them to explore the fun side of stories as well as link it to other areas of the curriculum.

IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL:

- Not reporting an absence will mean that your child's absence is marked as Unexplained.

December was a pretty difficult month for attendance, with every year group being down and some significantly down. This was due to the high level of sickness bugs and infections going around... which is out of everyone's control! Lets make a conscious effort to maximise attendance at school when children are fit and healthy.

HABITUAL LATE ARRIVAL:

As well as early collections, we have so many children who arrive late every day. For some, this is an habitual thing, meaning it happens almost every day (if not every day!)

I outlined the issues with this last term and I continue to appeal to everyone... try and get your child to school BEFORE the bell! Aim for 8:55am, just to be sure. It is a long walk from the gate, to the cloakroom, to the classroom, especially for P4-7!

P7 TRIP OUTDOOR EDUCATION TRIP 10th to 14th March 2025 at Palacerigg Country Park, Cumbernauld

Our Primary 7 children are invited to attend a week long Outdoor Education experience at Palacerigg Country Park. This is a change to the usual venues of Strathclyde Country Park, due to ongoing refurbishments and improvement works being carried out.

How much does it cost?

- Parent Council will pay £20 per child
- The school will pay £10 per child
- Parents/Carers are asked to pay £90 This can be paid online.

If you do not wish to take advantage of the reduced rate, you can pay £120 in full and we will use the other money to support other families.

What is provided?

- Daily Transport to and from Palacerigg
- All specialist equipment
- Expert Coaches to work with the children

How do I sign my child up?

 All P7 children have been issued with a permission form which should be returned by FRIDAY 21st FEBRUARY 2025.

Please do not let cost be a barrier to your child attending this trip. Our children have always had a wonderful time during their week away.

ICT PURCHASE

We have purchased a further 10 laptops to add to our existing stock. This takes us to around 60 laptops for use in the school. We will continue to increase the number as and when finances allow. This recent purchase cost us just over £5000 from the school budget.

We are now looking into purchasing a charging trolley, which can store and safely charge around 20 devices at a time. These cost in the region of £1200 each, so this is another significant investment which we will need to make.

These device trolleys allow us to charge safely overnight in a ventilated unit, which is lockable and therefore more secure, protecting our devices.

CAR PARK SAFETY

Safety in our Car Park continues to be a concern. I would highlight all of the usual concerns like double/ triple parking, parking on the double yellows, mounting the pavement and adults being abusive to someone who politely asks them to move and let them out.

A particular concern is Parents/Carers allowing their children to exit the car into the path of other moving vehicles. If you do this, you are putting your child in danger and there is very little we can do to protect them! Mrs Martin and I regularly see this happening. Children exit in the middle of the road, or when a car is parked up and not in a space.

We often see children walking from one end of the car park to the other (not on a pavement) and cars are trying to reverse into a space. Not all children have the spatial awareness, nor can they risk assess and know that a car will be reversing. These are definite moments where our hearts are in our mouths!

PLEASE, PLEASE TRY TO BE A SAFE AND CONSIDERATE USER OF OUR CAR PARK ALWAYS!

CREATING YOUNG ENGINEERS
