Primary 7 - Confirmation

Thursday 5th February 2026 at 7pm in St. Gabriel's Church with Bishop Toal.

If you have not attended one of the meetings and you have not let your Parish Priest know that you wish to enrol your child for one of the above Sacraments, then please do so as soon as possible. It would be helpful if you let the school know too.

If you are intending on requesting baptism for your child, you should do this sooner rather than later. Without Baptism, your child cannot make their First Confession.

We do not need PVGs for those who volunteer in school for an activity that is supervised by a member of school staff.

However, we think we DO need PVGs for those who are accompanying children on a school trip.

THE PARENT COUNCIL APPROACH TO PVG is managed separately and I know that they are already looking into this.

Attendance Update

In the next week, I will be contacting Parents/Carers if we have a concern about attendance levels. Our current overall attendance level for the school is **92%.** Each class' average attendance is noted below. Only 7 out of 15 classes are indicated in green (as in, they are hitting or exceeding the target). Those in red are below the target, some are significantly low.

The children travel by bus each day from school and return for the end of the school day.






