### **Attendance Update**

During the month of November, our average attendance dropped significantly to **88%.** In August, it was 94%! This is a concerning drop. Our school target for this year is 92.5%. You'll notice that only 4 out of our 15 classes are green, i.e. they are on track with their overall attendance.




