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

## 'Promoting the Gospel Values

Catholic Education Week began with mass in St.Lucy's Church on 17th November. Many children attended mass to represent our school wearing their uniform with pride and participated very respectfully in the liturgy. Well done! Many thanks to personnel and pupils from Our Lady's High School (OLHS) who also attended. We worked in partnership with OLHS to produce a cluster booklet on how we promote the Gospel Values- the theme of this year's Catholic Education Week. During Catholic Education Week 19 of our P7 children received the Sacrament of Confirmation from the Archbishop in Sacred Heart alongside children from St. Andrew's and St. Margaret of Scotland. Congratulations to all!

#### Positive Behaviour/Relationships

I thought it would be helpful for me to remind you of what we do in St.Lucy's to promote the 'Gospel Values' which in turn encourages positive behaviour/relationships throughout our school community.

Pride of St Lucy Awards- Any member of staff throughout our school community may award a child with a 'Pride of St.Lucy' sticker when he/she is showing 'Pride' in our school. This may be evident in his/her work, his/her conduct both, within and outwith the school. Children are also encouraged to demonstrate 'Pride' in our school by wearing full school uniform. Each child has an individual bookmark to stick the stickers awarded to him/her. At the end of each term, the Class Teachers count the number of 'Pride of St.Lucy' stickers each child has and the child who has the greatest number of stickers is awarded a 'Pride of St.Lucy' medal at our termly 'Pride of St.Lucy' termly assembly. At the end of the school year, there is an overall 'Pride of St.Lucy' winner who receives a medal and his/her name is engraved on the 'Pride of St. Lucy' shield.

#### Rising Star Award

This award is given weekly to one child per class by the Class Teacher. Children receive this award for demonstrating the 'Three Rs'- Respect for Yourself, Respect for Others and Responsibility for your Actions. This is celebrated during our weekly assembly where each 'Rising Star' is announced and congratulated.



## Menu Changes in Dinner Hall

The Scottish Government is driving improvements in school meals and as you should be aware, the new Primary menu cycle went live on Wed 20th November 2019. You will have noticed a lot of changes have been made to this menu. All meals will be served with a minimum two portion offering of vegetables and all drinks containing free sugars will be removed. All meals will include a carton of milk or chilled tap water. Aqua juice and Calypso cup will no longer be available. Water in jugs or cartons of milk will be the only drink options for school meals. Ham sandwiches are now no longer available and have been replaced with sliced chicken three times per week. The NLC website will be updated and will include a link which explains in more detail the rationale from Hmie about the changes.

## Christmas Lunch



As you aware, Christmas Lunch will be served in school for our children on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> December. If your son/daughter does not want a Christmas lunch then he/she should bring a packed lunch with him/her on the 5<sup>th</sup> December as the only options available on this day are turkey, steak pie and a vegetarian meal. Separate correspondence will have already been received.

## Paperless Communication

As you are aware more and more of our communication with parents is done electronically—text message, twitter etc. This seems to be very successful for the majority of parents as it is instantaneous and goes directly to them. All newsletters and any letters which do not need to be signed etc. will be sent electronically, this will not only cut down on cost but is environmentally friendly. As you know, arranging appointments for Parents' Evening in October was all done electronically. Despite some parents experiencing a few initial technical issues, on the whole this system was very positive. Many thanks to Mrs Smith and Mrs McGarvey who worked very hard to ensure the smooth running of this initiative. In January 2020, I am delighted to announce that we will be launching our new school app. This app will provide quick and easy access to information and messages from our school.

#### Managing Attendance/Late Coming



All Head Teachers within North Lanarkshire Council (NLC) are required to monitor the attendance of all children. I recently contacted specific parents/carers to inform them that their child's attendance was below North Lanarkshire's target of 95%. If you received a letter and are concerned about this, please feel free to contact me at school and we can work together to achieve improvements. May I please take this opportunity to remind you that if your son/daughter is unwell/unable to attend school, could you please contact the school office at your earliest convenience? If we have not heard from you regarding your son/daughter's absence we will send you a text no later than 9.30am. Let's make every day count for our children!

#### Registration for Primary One 2020-2021

If your son/daughter will reach the age of 5 between 1<sup>st</sup> March 2020 and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2021 then he/she should be registered for school in January *(WB 13<sup>th</sup> January)* to begin Primary 1 in August 2020. Confirmed dates and times of when to enrol in St. Lucy's will be published and displayed in the local community/twitter.

Parents/Carers must bring the following documents along to register their child-

- Child's Birth Certificate
- Council Tax bill (Proof of Address)
- Child's Baptismal Certificate (if applicable)

### <u>Best Start Grant -</u> <u>School Age Payment</u>

I would like to remind you again of

The Best Start Grant- School Age Payment.
The School Age Payment is the third Best Start
Grant package of payments that is providing extra
money to families in Scotland who are on a low
income to help support their child during their early
years.

The Best Start Grant does not replace the Clothing Grant offered by North Lanarkshire Council.

The Best Start Grant - School Age Payment from Social Security Scotland is a one off payment of

£250 available around the time a child would normally start Primary 1.

The first application window for the School Age Payment will run from 3 June 2019 to 29 Feb 2020 for children who were born from 1 March 2014 to 28 Feb 2015, inclusive will be the right age for their parent/carers to claim.

## Points to Remember-

School hours -

9am-10.30am 10.30am-10.45am- INTERVAL \*12.15pm-1pm- LUNCH 1pm-3pm

(\*on the day of your child's Christmas Party, he/she may be collected from the school office at 12 o'clock)

Nursery hours-

AM- 8.40am-11.50am PM- 12.45pm-3.55pm

- No child should bring food/drinks containing nuts or nut products such as Nutella to school/nursery
- Fizzy drinks are not permitted in school/nursery
- Class drinking bottles should be filled with PLAIN WATER ONLY
- No football strips/logos are permitted in school, this includes lunch boxes and school baas
- During school hours, mobile phones will be stored securely in the school office
- Parents should 'drop' children off at the relevant yard gates and NOT enter the yards. Members of staff will supervise the yards each morning from 8.50am
- Infant parents may come into the yards at 3pm to collect children. Please stay near to fence to allow safe/clear passage.
- Shirts and ties should be worn EVERY day
- A change of shoes should be kept in school
- Any child going home for lunch should be collected from the Main Office at 12.15pm
- All P1-3 children receive a free school meal at lunch time as per the Scottish Government initiative.
- Children moving from P3 into P4 are no longer automatically entitled to Free School Meals. Applications are required. Relevant information has been submitted to P4.
