Paperless Communication

As you are aware more and more of our communication with parents is done electronically—text message, twitter etc. This seems to be very successful for the majority of parents as it is instantaneous and goes directly to them. All newsletters and any letters which do not need to be signed etc. will be sent electronically, this will not only cut down on cost but is environmentally friendly. We launched the Xpressions app in January. This app will provide quick and easy access to information and messages from our school.

Xpressions is completely free of charge to you and can be installed on your mobile phone or tablet. It supports both Apple iOS and Android devices. Alternatively, you can visit <u>xpressions.groupcall.com</u> from any internet browser on your computer, laptop or mobile device. If you have children in different schools and those schools also use **Groupcall Xpressions**, you will be able to view information on multiple children within the same app and same login.

It is vital we have your correct mobile number and email address on our school database to ensure you can use Xpressions as soon as it is available. You will need these as well to log into Xpressions - we do not issue you username or passwords.

Step 1 Type <u>xpressions.groupcall.com into search</u> <u>engine or Groupcall Xpressions</u> into the app store.

Step 2 Enter your email address and phone number (these MUST match the details we have on record for you.)

Step 3 A code will then be emailed to you and you should be good to go!

We will begin using the Xpressions app from Monday 20th January 2020. If you experience any difficulties please contact the office.

If you have not already downloaded the Xpressions app I would encourage you to please do so following the steps above.
