<p>Listen to the Story</p>  <p><u>Handa's Surprise</u></p>	<p>Fruit Chart</p> <p>What is your favourite fruit? Why don't you make a chart and ask your family what their favourite fruit is? What one is the most popular? Or you could make a chart with how many pieces of fruit you have in 1 week.</p>	<p>Make your own Musical Instrument</p> <p>Have a look around the house to find items you can use to make some music.</p> <p>Click here for some ideas.</p> 	<p>Let's go on a '7' Hunt</p> <p>Handa collects 7 pieces of fruit.</p> <p>Can you go on a hunt and find 7 items? We can use these in another activity.</p> <p>Can you find the number 7 while you're out on your walk?</p>
<p>Create an Animal Mask</p> <p>Can you create your own African animal mask?</p> 	<p>Fruity Snack</p> <p>Can you prepare a piece of fruit for your snack?</p> <p>Will you need to peel it? Chop it? Mash it?</p> 	<p>Let's Dance</p> <p>Use your musical instrument and let's dance to some traditional African music.</p> <p>Big African Animals African Safari Toom-Bah-Ee-Lero Che Che Koolay</p>	<p>Kim's Game</p> <p>You will need items that you find and a blanket or towel. Put 3 items under the towel. Get someone to take an item out. Can you guess what item is missing?</p> <p>Increase the number of items for extra challenge.</p>
<p>Think about the Story</p> <p>What fruit did Handa have in the basket? What animals did you see? What happened to the fruit? What was Akeyo's favourite fruit? - What was the surprise?</p>	<p>Fruity Feely Bag</p> <p>You will need a pillow case and a variety of fruit.</p> <p>Put all of the fruit in the pillow case. Close your eyes and put your hand inside.</p> <p>Can you describe the fruits you're feeling?</p>	<p>Balance Challenge</p> <p>Can you balance something on your head?</p> <p>Ask your family to do the same and have a challenge.</p> <p>Who can go the furthest without it falling off?</p>	<p>Let's go Searching</p> <p>With an adult, search online for pictures of some of the animals from the story.</p> <p>Have you seen one before? Do they have a pattern? What size do you think they are?</p>

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
