## Car Park



Our car park is a very busy area which we monitor daily. As per previous communication, I would like to remind you there is no drop off/pick up area for pupils available and I ask for your support in this area to ensure safe passage for all. The majority of pupils from our LCSC are transported to school by taxi and spaces are allocated for these taxis.

## Health and Safety REMINDERS -

The Health and Safety of all within our School, LCSC and Nursery Class is paramount and your continued support in this area is very much appreciated. I have outlined some reminders below to ensure safe passage for everyone-

- No dogs are permitted on school grounds, including dogs in arms (this does not apply to Assistance Dogs)
- Due to the volume of people present, NO cycling/scootering is permitted within our playgrounds at 'Drop Off' and 'Pick Up' times.
- **ALL** parents/carers **MUST** remain outside our school grounds at 'Drop Off' times. Staff are present from 8.50am to supervise
- Parents of P1, P2 and P3 children may enter the Infant playground at 3pm to minimise crowding at the gate. Primary 3 parents must remain behind the line to help staff ensure safe dismissal of children to an identified adult

## Pitch

As you will be aware, our P4-7 pupils have access to the pitch during intervals and lunchtimes. In order to protect footwear and in a bid to keep our floors and toilets clean, we have asked those using the pitch to bring in an old pair of trainers to change into. Many thanks for your support in this area.
