All pupils must wear:

- Blazer (purchased from Scotcrest Uniforms)
- White formal shirt/blouse
- School Tie: specific Tie for S1-4, S5 & S6 (a new S6 Tie will be gifted to S6 in August 2025 to mark the 50th anniversary of the school)
- Grey trousers/skirt *
- Black footwear/shoes
- No items of clothing should have designer or manufacturers' logos or labels visible (Hoodies are not permitted inside the school building)

Pupil PE Kit:

- White T-shirt or School T-shirt or School hoodie
- Black shorts/joggers/tracksuit bottoms/leggings
- Warm clothes for outdoor activities
- Training shoes for indoor and outdoor activities

*Girls may wear burgundy/tartan skirts available from Scotcrest.

Guidance for Parents/Carers/Families

- The wearing of the school blazer, shirt and tie is the expected standard at all times.
- Grey crew neck jumpers that cover the school tie are not permitted.
- Grey quarter zip and V-neck jumpers or cardigans, with the school tie clearly visible, are permitted. These should not be branded with designer logos.
- An official school hoodie (with school logo) can be worn, especially during colder weeks, but must be worn with the school Blazer outside of class.
- Pupils who are not dressed appropriately will be provided with items from school stock.
- Pupils must take all outdoor jackets off (apart from the school Blazer) while inside the school building.
 Staff will issue a school Blazer to replace inappropriate items of uniform.
- In Physical Education, pupils must have the appropriate kit including trainers and outdoor footwear. NO "team" colours are permitted.
- PE kit must **NOT** be worn before or after PE lessons unless directly asked to do so by staff.
- Please be aware of the health and safety implications for items of clothing such as loose clothing in practical subjects and other accessories and excessive jewellery.
