### Literacy



Read 2 chapters from your school novel or one you have been enjoying at home and make notes in relation to our 6 strategies. Choose from:-

## Interdisciplinary Learning

Create a winter workout – how can you keep fit in the snow?

Create a healthy recipe for a winter snack/meal. Ask an adult to help you make it. Make a poster/leaflet on keeping safe in winter.
