Active Tasks

Type It!	Hopscotch	Air Write
Type your spelling words on a computer, tablet or phone. You can also borrow a paper keyboard from class if you need to.	Use chalk to make a hopscotch board in your garden or on the pavement. Fill your board with letters instead of numbers and hop your words!	Write your spelling words in the air using your finger. Have someone at home read your words as you write them!
Create Your Own	Spelling Snap	Spelling Bee
Try to think of your own fun way to practise your spelling words and then do it! Don't forget to share your great idea with the class!	Cut some paper into cards and write each word on two cards to make your very own game of 'Snap' then have fun playing with someone at home.	Hold your own 'Spelling Bee' at home. Have someone test your on spelling each of your words aloud! How many did you manage to spell correctly?
Trace a Word	Spellerize	Words Around Me
Trace each of your words of someone's palm or their back. See if they can guess your words – you could have a go at guessing too!	Spell your words aloud and reach up high when you say a tall letter, put hands on your hips when you say a middle letter and reach down low for letters that dip below the line!	Look out for your words or even the letters you need to spell them in the environment around you. You could even take a picture of these using technology from home.
Cotton Bud Spelling	Nature Spell	Messy Words
Lay out cotton buds to spell each of your words.	Use any natural materials you can find to write your words on the ground. Leaves, sticks and stones are just perfect for this!	Spread out some messy materials like flour, salt or shaving foam and use your finger to trace each word.

Formal Written Tasks

Elkonin Boxes	Rhyming Words	Surround Words
Write each of your spelling words, using a coloured pencil to split each word into its different sounds, like so: t ea ch e r	Write each of your spelling words. Next to each write a rhyming word. If necessary, it can be a nonsense word (as long as it follows the same spelling pattern).	Write each of your words three times using a pencil. Afterwards, use a coloured pencil to trace around the shape of each word.
Write a Story	UPPER and lower	ABC Order
Write a story using all of your spelling words. Be sure to underline the words with a coloured pencil when you use them!	Write each of your spelling words three times in UPPERCASE and then three times in lowercase.	First write your spelling words in a list. Next write the words another twice in alphabetical order.
Hidden Words	Consonant Circle	Bubble Writing
Draw and colour a picture. Hide your spelling words inside the pictures.	Write each of your spelling words three times. Go back and use a coloured pencil to circle all of the consonants in each word.	Write each of your spelling words in bubble writing and colour them in with a different coloured pencil when you are done.
Red and Blue Writing	Spelling Flower	Colourful Words
Using a blue and red coloured pencil, write each of your words three times. Vowels should be written in red and consonants in blue.	Draw a picture of a big flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the petals or on a leaf. If you run out of space, just draw another!	Write each of your spelling words three times. Write each new word using a different coloured pencil.

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
