SUPERVISION IN SCHOOL: JANUARY 2021

A limited number of pupils will attend the school building from Monday 11 January. Pupils attending will either have been specifically invited by the school or have applied for a place in school where both parents/carers are key workers.

Key Worker

To follow the correct procedures, parents/carers who are both key workers, and have applied for a place in school, should provide their child with evidence of key worker status and hand this into the school Office. The school will be in touch with parents/carers if pupils are not eligible.

Supervision Arrangements

Arrangements for pupils attending the school building are as follows:

- Pupils can access **normal transport arrangements**. Any changes will be communicated to families.
- **Normal school uniform** should be worn.
- All pupils should **enter the school via the front entrance** and hand sanitise when entering the building.
- Pupils must sign in using the **Sign-In sheet at the desk under the Janitor's window**.
- Pupils should report to the following **IT suites** as follows:
 - **S1: Business Room 1 & 2**
 - **S2: Technical Room 38 & 40**
 - **S3: Business Room 3 & English Room 1**
 - **S4: RE Room 57**
 - **S5/6: Library**
- Pupils must follow the **health and safety measures**, which include:
 - **Hand sanitise** and wear a face covering when entering the school building.
 - **Hand sanitise** when moving into any new area or classroom.
 - **Wear a face covering** when they are outside a classroom, in corridors, and moving inside the building.
 - In S4-6, **pupils and staff must wear a face covering** inside the classroom.
 - **All pupils are asked to stay inside the school for the duration of the day**. This means accessing the school dining area or bringing a packed lunch. We would ask pupils not to mix with other people at the retail park and then return to the school to reduce any infection risk.
