


Main Entrance




In your primary school you spend most of your time in your classroom with the same teacher.

School Work


Your teachers will give you jotters and work. You will be responsible for bringing these in each day.

Packed Lunch

Packed lunches are kept in your bag until lunch time. You can eat your packed lunch in the canteen.

Lunch Money

If you are having a school dinner you should bring in money to put on your card.



PE Kit

You will need this on PE days. T-Shirt (White plain) Black shorts and socks, trainers.

Pencil Case

It is your responsibility to be organised for classes. Make sure you have: Pencil, pen, rubber, sharpener and a ruler.

Water Bottle

It is important to bring some water (not juice!) with you each day. There are water dispensers in school if you need to refill.

School Uniform



It is important to ensure you are wearing your uniform every day. This shows you are willing to be part of the St Maurice's Community and have pride in our school.

You must wear your blazer at all times in school. You should not wear jackets or hoodies over your blazer when you are in school.

Black blazer with school badge

White traditional shirt (not a polo shirt)

School tie

Black <u>v-neck</u> sweatshirt or jumper (<u>not</u> a cardigan)

Black dress trousers (<u>not</u> jeans etc)

Black shoes

GIRLS

Black blazer with school badge

White button-up school shirt/blouse with buttons to collar (<u>not</u> leaving a gap blouse to trousers or collar to neck)

School tie

Black <u>v-neck</u> jumper or <u>v-neck</u> sleeveless top. (<u>not</u> a cardigan and <u>not</u> a vest top)

Black <u>traditional</u> skirt of a "modest" length or black dress trousers. (<u>not</u> shorts, culotted, footless tights etc)

Black shoes – <u>socks must be worn below</u> <u>the knee.</u>

What should I do if....?



I missed my bus home

Go to the school office. There is someone there until 4.30pm each day and they will make arrangements to get you home.

I forgot my PE kit

Parents/Carers can be called to bring it, sometimes there are spare kits available in the PE department, however it is better to bring your own. Remember to use your homework diary and timetable to remind you.

I have lost something


Try to think where you last were and retrace your steps. Report the loss to your teacher or support staff. There is a lost property area, if you ask a member of office staff or the janitor, they can let you look. Check at home. When you find it put your name on it.

I do not understand my work

Always ask your teacher or support staff for help. If you do not ask, they do not know you have not understood. If you are stuck with your homework family members can sometimes help, but do not let them do it for you.

I forgot my homework

Teachers understand that sometimes pupils do forget their homework and take this into consideration. However, it is better if you keep notes about homework in your homework diary and look at it at night to remind you.

Who should I go to if.....?



I forgot my packed lunch or money

School Office. A phone call to parents/carers can be made or money can be given to you on loan until the next day. There will always be a way to get your lunch. You could also speak to James in the canteen or one of the members of staff on duty in the canteen at lunchtime. Please do not go hungry.

I feel ill or I am injured at school

School Office. If you are feeling unwell during a lesson, say to the teacher and they will supply you with a slip explaining your reason for being out of class and you should take that with you to the school office. If you are ill or injured during lunchtime, report to a teacher, a member of support staff or the school office.

Talk to any of the adults listed above, your buddy or any other adult in the school that you think may help you. The person you speak to may signpost you to a more appropriate member of staff to talk to dependent on the issue. Always sort out problems as early as possible!

Where should I go for....?



Break and Lunchtimes

All S1 pupils are asked to remain in the school building or grounds during break and lunchtimes. You are **not permitted** to go to the retail park, up to Condorrat village or over to the van. You are asked to go to the outside area between modern languages and maths or stay inside in the assembly hall or canteen. There are picnic tables outside where you sit and eat and talk to your friends.

What can I eat?

You can buy food at the canteen before school, at the interval and at lunchtime. The menu is on display in the canteen and at lunchtime and there are many options to choose from - the main meal of the day, soup, paninis, pizza, sandwiches, baguettes, hot pasta and lots of tasty treats like cookies and muffins.

You can also bring a packed lunch if you prefer.

How do I pay?

You pay using your Young Scot card which you can top up from one of the 2 machines in the school. There is one in the canteen and one at the top of the ramp. (You'll get your card and pin number when you start at St Maurice's HS).

The toilet

There are designated toilets around the school for all pupils – the main toilets are found in the main corridor, just outside the canteen.
