HALLOWE'EN PARADE

The infants, including the nursery and P. 1 - 3 pupils, will take part in our Hallowe'en Parade on Tuesday $31^{\rm st}$ Oct at 1.30 p.m. within the school. The children can either go home at lunchtime and return in their costumes or they can bring them into school in the morning and



will be helped into them after lunch. Children who may not wish to dress up are under no obligation to do so. All parents and carers are welcome to come along and enjoy the parade in the school hall. P.7 HIGH SCHOOL OPEN EVENING

The first transition event will take place at St Maurice's High School on Wednesday 11th October from 6.00 - 7.00 p.m. The evening will begin with an introduction from key staff who will support your child and an overview of transition events which will take place over the course of the academic year. You will then visit classrooms and hear from subject specialist about the S1 curriculum. P.7 pupils are welcome to attend.

BREAKFAST CLUB



This supervised service is available to all our children from 8.15 a.m. All children must be supervised until they enter the building. Parents should be aware that any children arriving before 8.15 a.m. may not have access to the building until Breakfast Club staff arrive. Please be aware that all children attending must purchase a breakfast. The breakfast consists of cereal, milk and toast. This is

free to pupils who are in Primary 1 to 5 and for pupils in Primary 6 to 7 who receive free school meals. For all other pupils the cost is £1 per day with a sliding scale for families of two at £1.50 per day and families of three at £1.80 per day. Children will then be dismissed into the playground at 8.45 a.m.

AFTERSCHOOL CLUBS

We are delighted to be able to give our children the opportunity to take part in many different extra-curricular clubs. If your child is not allocated a place this term, there will be another block of clubs in the new year.

PARENTS NIGHT/OPEN AFTERNOON



Details have been emailed to parents regarding the process of booking parents' night appointments. One parent/carer slot is allocated per child. Two parental appointments for one child will only be allocated where legal paperwork dictates it. Should you choose to remove your child from school due to a pre booked holiday on this date, we will be unable to provide another appointment in line

with the school's priority to improve attendance for all pupils post covid.

COMMUNICATION

Please ensure they have another outdoor jacket for playtime and lunchtime, as we do not want anyone sitting in class in a wet fleece.
