Dear Parent/Carers,

I am pleased to say all the children have settled well and there is great learning evident in all the classes. This is another busy term with much to look forward to. Please take a note of all the important dates detailed in this newsletter.

ENTRY AND DISMISSAL ARRANGEMENTS FROM SCHOOL GATES

The infant and senior gates will be opened by staff at 8.50 a.m. Pupils can enter by either gate and then make their way to the appropriate yard, where they will be supervised by school staff. Please remember that breakfast club is available from 8.15 a.m. Should your child arrive late for school (after 9.00 a.m.) please ensure they enter via the main school entrance and report to the school office. Children must use pupil gates and not enter via the main door prior to 9.00 a.m.



The arrangements for dismissal at 3.00 p.m. are as follows:-

Basketball Court Primary 1, Primary 2/1 and Primary 3/2 Infant Gate Primary 3, Primary 4 and Primary 5

Senior Gate Primary 6/5, Primary 6, Primary 7A and Primary 7B Pupil may exit via the infant gate or basketball court gate with younger siblings should it be required. I politely request that school parents and carers do not enter the yard at 3.00 p.m. but wait at the appropriate dismissal area to collect their child.

CLASS HOMEWORK

STEM

This year, we have been working hard to inspire our pupils through STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). Our hard-working committee have been busy building their own skills by gathering and



exploring exciting new resources with the aim to share their expertise with their classmates. Our vision is to inspire and build confidence in others to help them achieve success in STEM. Great work has taken place already and we are gathering evidence with the hope of achieving a STEM Nation Award. Lots of super science experiments have taken place in our STEM



classroom as well as practical engineering and technology activities which our pupils have loved. In addition to this, our Primary 7 pupils have been working hard on their journey to becoming Young Stem Leaders. They have shown they are inspiring role models by planning activities and delivering lessons to our infant classes, embedding a love of STEM for future generations!

DIGITAL COMMITTEE



Having received our Digital Award last year our Digital Committee are keen to keep improving the use of digital across our school in all areas of the curriculum. Our Digital Committee have used the results of our Smart Council survey to come up with a timetable of classes that we will visit to teach them how to use the app, Scratch Jnr. The Committee have already delivered this lesson to Primary 3/2 and are looking forward to delivering it to the rest of the infant department. We will then use

the results of our digital survey to deliver different lessons to the middle and upper school classes depending on what best suits their needs.

READING SCHOOL

Thank you to everyone for working alongside us on our journey to becoming A Reading School. We are now well on our way.

We have participated in whole class visits to our school library on a weekly basis to promote Reading for Pleasure. Children are fully engaged learning about authors and genres. They have used library time to work in groups as well as independently.

We have been visiting the local library to enhance our community links, thank you to all parents/carers who are now attending the library on a regular basis. We are delighted to have parents attend the school library to help out.



Peer Reading with upper children and infants, writing their own books, using drama to tell stories and choosing books to ensure a fully stocked library has been successful. Parents and carers enjoyed helping out with the infants with the launch of Book Bugs. Thank you for supporting your children in reading at home.

PUPIL RIGHTS COMMITTEE



We are continuing to work towards our Rights Respecting School Silver Award. As part of this, the Pupil Rights Committee have asked the children for their opinion on how we can improve our school. Using our Smart Council survey, we asked the children to come up with ideas for games which they would like to use in our school playground. Following this survey, the committee asked for donations of toys which we were so grateful to receive. Thanks to these donations the Committee were

able to create a number of playground boxes which the children are now enjoying at playtime and lunchtime. As a committee, we are always striving to improve our school and the children are continuing to share their views on how we can keep improving our school playground, add more activities and make our playground a fun and engaging place to play. The Committee are now hoping to work with the Parent Council to raise money to continue to develop our playground through painted playground markings and new equipment.

SCHOOL UNIFORM
