Homework and Microsoft Teams

Reading books should be in bags <u>each day</u> as we need them in class. All children should now also have access to Microsoft Teams using their Glow username and password. Reading Books



Reading books will be issued to children on a **Monday**. The books sent home will have been read in class that day. We also ask that children please return books to school each day as they will also be working on these in class daily.

Outdoor Learning



We are very lucky in St Michael's to have access to wonderful grounds and school forest. We will be visiting the forest when we can. Children should bring an outdoor kit with their PE KIT each week. <u>Wet Clothes</u>



As the weather changes it may be a good idea to include a change of socks/tights in children's bags. Many children come in from playtimes with wet socks and we always try our best to keep your child comfortable by removing socks and drying them on the radiator. At times, these do not dry on time for the next play so a change of socks would be very helpful. Accidents can also happen in school and so a change of pants and tracksuit bottoms/leggings could also be included in a small pack which can be kept in children's bags.

Names and Lost Property

Children are encouraged to keep all belongings safely in their bag however, I would appreciate if you could ensure names are on each item of clothing and any property such as water bottles and packed lunches. I will also post any property found in class without a name on our class team. We are already missing a blazer which was labelled with the child's name, please check the blazer your child has brought home is their own.
