Dear Parents, Carers and Families,

It sometimes feels like the Covid rollercoaster never ends! We are almost at Christmas so hopefully everyone keeps safe and well until Santa arrives!

Covid update

The current Covid measures in school remain the same and we are ensuring hand washing, distancing and staff mask wearing are continuing. We will update you as soon as possible should North Lanarkshire advise us of any changes.

Government guidance has been updated regarding self-isolating so please ensure you follow this <u>https://www.gov.scot/coronavirus-covid-19/</u>

'The rules on self-isolation for household contacts has changed.

If you're identified as a household contact of a positive COVID-19 case, you are advised to self-isolate for 10 days - irrespective of vaccination status, PCR test result and age.

If you think you have COVID-19 symptoms you should self-isolate immediately and take a PCR test.

If you don't have symptoms, make sure you do a lateral flow test before you meet up with other households, travel to see people, or visit busy places. You can get them from test sites, pharmacies or online.'

Pupils isolating

We will be in touch with our digital offer should your child be required to selfisolate or they have Covid but have no symptoms.

Online learning

At the beginning of term children were issued with their logins for Reading Eggs/Express, Sumdog, Big maths, Teams and Glow. Please make sure your child knows them. There is also guidance of how to access all online learning in the information section on our school app.

If a whole class is required to isolate the class teacher will assume responsibility for the digital learning with learning that meets your child's needs as best we can and with the class teacher being online for support and regular check ins.

Collecting and Drop off at school

This has not changed but please ensure you stick to:

- One adult collecting/dropping off your child/ren
- Adults should wear a face mask (unless exempt)
- Keep 2m distance from other adults in the infant collection and drop off area
- Keep your child beside you, to ensure any vulnerable adults are not bumped into or put at risk.
