## Punctuality and Attendance

It is very important that children attend school regularly, and we ask that except in exceptional family circumstances, parents do not organise holidays outwith school holiday times. The school cannot give permission

for these holidays. However in exceptional circumstances children can be granted permission for time off e.g. a religious festival. NLC attendance target is 95%.

In addition, it is important that children are in class at the start of the school day. If your child is late for school, he/she should enter via the main entrance. Children coming in by this entrance are marked late on the school register. The school will monitor your child's attendance and punctuality and if there is any cause for concern, you will be lettered.

If your child is absent from school, the school should be informed by telephone before 9:30am. If you have not informed the school by this time you will be sent a text message asking you to contact us.

Please remember it is vitally important that the school has <u>up to date</u> home, work and emergency contact numbers.

# For all absences, a written note of explanation should be brought on return to school.

**Homework Diaries** have been distributed. Please check and sign diaries regularly. The diaries are also very useful for passing information between home and school, so do make any little notes or comments that you wish to draw to the teacher's attention.

Please remember to put your child's name on <u>all</u>items of clothing etc - JACKETS, BLAZERS, OUTDOOR SHOES & INDOOR SHOES, SWEATSHIRTS, JUMPERS, SHIRTS, BAGS, PACKED LUNCH BOXES etc.

Items get mixed up very easily or left in the playground, football pitch or dining room. Often a mix up happens and a child takes home the wrong jacket or sweatshirt and if not returned the next day, it may not be noticed for several days or even weeks.

### Session 2017- 2018

This year, the priorities for school improvement include raising and monitoring attainment to reduce the attainment gap between groups of children, to continue to further develop interdisciplinary and outdoor learning, and to further develop as a community of faith by reviewing the school vision and communication with parents.
