PHASED RETURN OF PUPILS TO SCHOOL

Staff across the school have been making preparations for the phased return of our pupils next week. Every pupil should return to school next week at the time outlined in the [letter sent to all Parents/Carers](#). A summary of the timetable is included below.

At this time, it is crucial that all pupils understand their responsibility for keeping everyone safe: masks must be worn by ALL pupils not just Senior Phase; (except those who are exempt); 2m distancing must be upheld; and, we all must make sure we are washing our hands and sanitising regularly.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL

What time should my child start on the day they are in school?

The school day starts and ends as usual: 8.55 every morning until 3.45 (Mon/Tue/Thu) and 2.55 (Wed/Fri). The only exception to this is for S6 pupils who have Private Study periods 1/2—this can be done at home.

How can my child join the LFT Covid Testing programme?

SP pupils can start testing immediately, as long as they have read the privacy notice and returned the consent form ([click here](#) to see all the necessary documents).

*For all pupils in S1-3, they will be able to start testing **AFTER THE EASTER BREAK**. To ensure readiness, every S1-3 pupil will receive a paper copy of the privacy and consent form when they are in next week which they can return the following week*

Must pupils come to school? Can they not just continue online?

Unless shielding or unwell, all pupils should attend school at their allotted time next week. This will allow pupils to reconnect socially and with learning. The remote learning experiences that will continue on Teams will be planned around the in-school learning experiences.

SQA UPDDATE FROM MR McQUAID



Following the Scottish Government's decision to cancel all National Qualification external examinations, all awards this year are now based on teacher judgement of evidence of learner attainment. This approach hopes to ensure fairness for pupils as it better recognises the reality of the disruption so many of our pupils have already had to their learning.

To support this for all levels of awards, the [Alternative Certification Model \(ACM\)](#) has been developed by the Scottish Qualification Authority (SQA). SQA have identified a number of stage timelines for all centres to follow. A very robust quality assurance process will be followed before provisional results are submitted to SQA in late June 2021. Click on the link above to view a summary of these timelines and what they entail for our pupils when they (hopefully) return to the classroom from Monday 15th April. At this stage, it is important that pupils continue to work closely with their teachers and submit the best possible work they are capable of.
