How to Access


- Navigate to the achieve website <u>Achieve (hashtag-learning.co.uk)</u>
- Click sign up and add your details (you can use your glow e-mail address and password so that you don't need to remember a new one)
- Type in the school or class code which you can get from your class teacher and this will then give you free access to all of the resources available.



Scholar offer 39 online courses aligned to the SQA curriculum at National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher level. The materials contain a variety of activities, tests and quizzes to support learning.

Benefits

- Independent learning students can use the materials to study anytime, anywhere, in school, college or home.
- Instant feedback provided The materials contain a variety of activities, tests and quizzes that offer instant feedback. This allows students to practice and build confidence as they work their way through the learning materials.
- Progress reports scores achieved in our online tests are recorded and students can use these to review their performance.

How to access

Pupils can gain access to Scholar straight from their glow launchpad. Once logged into glow, pupils should click on the Taylor High School Launchpad (See diagram below) where they will see a tile to click to gain access to Scholar.. There is no need for any other usernames or passwords.
