ASSEMBLIES—STANDARDS & SAFETY

Our most recent series of Yeargroup Assemblies started this week. Between now and the summer, we will be supporting our young people to understand their roles and responsibilities in maintaining the high standards of our school, and to consider a number of areas related to safety. It would be a great support if parents/carers could discuss these points with our young people at home:

- Attendance & Timekeeping: it is essential that all our young people attend school and classes each day on time. If any young person is sick or unable to come to school, the school office should be notified by a parent or carer.
- Respect & Kindness: every human being has the right to be treated with respect and dignity. This can come from our words, actions and our thoughtfulness. Treating others the way we wish to be treated is a Golden Rule that will help everyone to keep relationships respectful, even online!
- Litter and the environment: we all have a common responsibility to keep our school and the community clean and tidy. Additional bins have been bought for the school grounds, and all pupils are asked to ensure that all rubbish is put in a bin either in school, or in the local community
- **Safety:** Our Campus Officer PC Barbara will be supporting our assemblies through talks on water safety and road safety. Young people and their families can access further information and videos online, for example: <u>Water Safety Scotland</u>.
- Throwing stones: we will also be talking to our young people about a worrying trend in the local area about stone-throwing; we would greatly appreciate your support in discussing this issue which can easily become a community and police matter.
- Online Safety: there have been a number of interactions between
 pupils on various social media platforms that can be hurtful and even
 lead to serious bullying behaviours. This <u>guide</u> can be a useful tool for
 parents and carers to understand how they can monitor their young
 people's use of social media and advise them on their online safety and
 wellbeing.
