Maximise Outcomes for all young learners


Define pathways which match the young person's aspirations

Qualifications....

National 3 and National 4 are unit-based qualifications with no external exam.

They are assessed within the school and will be externally verified by SQA colleagues.

National 3 and 4 qualifications are marked as Pass or Not Achieved.



Qualifications....

National 5 is assessed externally which may be carried out by more than one method, for example a coursework and a question paper which will be assessed and marked by SQA.

National 5 qualifications are graded A – D or No Award



Qualifications....

 Higher Qualifications are assessed externally which may be carried out by more than one method, for example a coursework and a question paper which will be assessed and marked by SQA.




Reduction of the curriculum to reflect key strengths and career interests

7 subjects will be taught for 4 periods per week in addition to 2 periods each of PE and RE



S4 Compulsory Subjects





Learners have studied 9 subjects (1 period of Spanish and 8 other subjects).

Apart from Maths, English, Core PE and Core RE, each Learner should confirm the 7 subjects that they wish to continue in S4.



The S5/6 Curriculum

32 Period Week

All students will study RE

Foundation Apprenticeships (S5 & S6)

What are Foundation Apprenticeships?

 Foundation Apprenticeships (FAs) give young people the combination of a qualification and valuable workplace experience in some of Scotland's most exciting growth industries. They can take two years to complete, but some can be completed in a year.



Foundation Apprenticeships



What are the benefits of FAs?

- S5 and S6 pupils can gain a qualification recognised by industry and employers set at SCQF level 6 (the same level as a higher) or SCQF level 5 (the same level as National 5)
- Colleges and Universities recognise FAs for entry alongside Highers and other qualifications
- FAs help with progression to a Modern or Graduate Apprenticeship
- FAs support the development of career management and employability skills as part of the wider development of skills for learning, life and work
- FAs connect learners with employers and the wider world of work
- FAs help learners develop understanding of the responsibilities and duties required by employers
- FAs support a flexible approach to work placements with better links to career aspirations as described in the 'Work Placement Standard'

Foundation Apprenticeships



Level 6

One-year delivery (S6 Only)

To complete a level 6 FA in one year, pupils must choose the subject in both column D and column E. Work placements will be organised for all day on a Friday and the pupil should be committed to doing this alongside their other studies.

Two-year delivery (S5 Only)

Pupils who choose to complete their FA at level 6 over 2 years should choose column D in the first year and then column E in the second year of delivery.

FAs in both Engineering and Civil Engineering can only be completed over 2 years due to course content.

Process for S3 to S4

Pupils will be issued a letter with a Tear Off Slip next week.

Discuss with your young person the questions raised in the previous slide

On Tear off, identify the subject they want to drop and the reason why: 1st Choice

Tear off slip should be returned to Mr McPake and Mr McLaughlin Follow up meeting will be organised to discuss choice



Process for Senior Phase (S4 & S5)

Mock options have taken place to allow us to maximise pupil choice

Options interview will take place in March before Easter

Options forms will be issues and pupils interviewed.

In S5 you will usually only choose subjects you studied in S4 in order to ensure progression. You will have the opportunity in August to adjust your choices, after considering your SQA results.

In S6, pupils will be encouraged to build upon their attainment from S4 and S5.
