A note from our Parent Council

Your parent council has been busy of the last few months attending school events and supporting the school with additional needs that fall outside of the day-to-day budget. At the start of the year, we arranged for a container to be purchased for storage. It quickly became apparent that while large and certainly created much needed valuable learning space inside the school, the container was just not big enough to clear the assembly and gym halls in their entirety. We therefore agreed to purchase a second container which arrived very quickly and clear the rest of the space. The two containers together cost approximately £3000 and this is simply not money that was available in the school budget. It is only with your continued support and attendance at events or donations that we can continue to support the school in this way. An example of how this is achieved is the amazing generosity and support at the Celebrating Success Evening back on the 18th September when we ran a raffle. Having a card reader was a great addition to this activity and we thank Mr Russell for arranging access for us, that one event raised just over £350 and we hope all of the lucky winners enjoyed their prizes. We have had the pleasure of also attending the Christmas Fayre, Christmas Concert Evening and got pre-view of the school decorated for the Snowball. We were blown away by the display of talent at the school concert and thank the music department for all of their hard work and dedication to our children to put on this performance. The decorations for this years Snowball were above and beyond and again; this would not be possible without the work from our schools' teachers to provide these experiences for our children.

We have made a slight change to the original engagement that we had planned and have decided to cancel the quiz night in favour of running a bigger activity in June. The proposal is to run a school Summer Fayre and Car Boot on Saturday 13th June before Scotland's first came in the World Cup in the early hours of Sunday 14th June. There is currently a live poll on Facebook, and we would appreciate your feedback, either their or via the school office or our own email pctaylorhighschool@northlanarkshire.npts.org.uk as to whether this is an event you would like to see run and would support in attendance.

As a group we do continue to engage with the school on a monthly basis (dates can be found on page 3). These meetings usually run for 90minutes, and we have recently introduced the ability to join via teams. We love to welcome new members and invite you all to attend as little or as often as you like. Advance reminders of upcoming meetings will be on the Facebook page and school newsletter. During engagement with the school, we cover a range of topics: attendance, attainment, health & well being, social inclusion, work experience, NET ministers, school transport and parking. We also engage with NLC Education team via parent consultations groups meaning that we have an opportunity to feed into conversations at local council level as well as school level to ensure your voice is heard.

We look forward to working together to support our school and children. Your involvement and support are invaluable to our school community. Together, we can make a significant impact and ensure that Taylor High continues to thrive and provide the best opportunities for our children.
