Further learning will include Anne Frank and former Nazi concentration camp, Auschwitz.

A huge thanks to parents for allowing their children to bring in photographs and medals from the war, which helps to put our learning into context.

Literacy

Our novels for this term: Alone on a wide wide sea, Carries War and Diary of a Wimpy Kid. We will continue to work on the 6 reading strategies using our books and poetry as stimulus. In addition, children are encouraged to read Horrible Histories WW2 book in class. December will allow for a media study on a Christmas film or adverts, where we will explore character, setting, themes and use of music.

In Taught Writing we will write instructions, poetry and expand on our narrative writing. Grammar focus will be on figurative language e.g. similes, metaphors, alliteration and onomatopoeia which will assist in uplevelling our writing. As ever, we want to maintain a high standard of work in our jotters.

In Numeracy and Maths we will be learning about

- * We will continue to practise our times tables and four procedures of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
