Literacy

This term the children will be focusing on poetry within the class to further develop their comprehension skills and use of language. Specifically we will be exploring how the writers develop theme, character and setting; as well as answering a variety of questions about what we have read.

Our writing focus for the coming term will be **narrative** and **instructional**. Children will be exploring elements of **figurative** language, direct speech and vocabulary to help them create stories that engage and interest the reader.

We will continue to work through our **North Lanarkshire** spelling programme, exploring a range of spelling rules and common words.

Numeracy

Children will continue to develop their mental fluency and number skills using the **Number Talks** programme. This term we will be focusing on exploring strategies for **addition** and **subtraction**, using carefully planned for 5-10 minute activities.

Within our wider maths children will continue to explore the theme of **number**, **money and measure** in greater depth. We will be focusing on our knowledge of the **four operations**, as well as **negative numbers**; **multiples**, **factors and primes**; **expressions and equations**; **and rounding**.
