The children will combine their PE and expressive skills as they learn some simple dance routines.

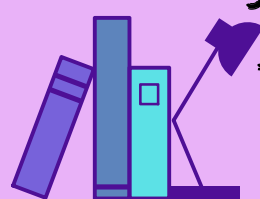
They will continue to learn French. The focus this term will be numbers, colours and days of the week.

Literacy



This term, our main focus is on improving reading fluency and accuracy. Please encourage your child to read for enjoyment at home and practise their word lists together.

In class, children will work on their comprehension, summarising and prediction skills when reading texts.

They will continue to enhance their writing skills. This term, the focus is on independent writing, where they will be creating various narrative texts. Accurate punctuation, spelling, and grammar will be emphasised throughout this process.



IDL



The current focus of the children's studies is on how water changes forms.

In the next unit, they will explore magnetism and work together to create their own magnetic game.

The children will also study Glasgow, learning about how the land has been used.
