

Read or listen to the story with your child. Display a bear in your window.

Take pictures of your bear in different places, for example when out for a walk or at a park.

Talk to your child about places the bear might like to visit.

Encourage your child to sing and join in with rhymes such as, 'Around, Around the Garden' and 'Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear'.

Make a bear mask from household materials or a paper plate.

Collect your child's teddies and soft toys and allow them to make a den with them.

Host a teddy bear picnic with your child in your garden or in your home. Help your child to make a healthy snack.

Collect a selection of teddy bears and order them from tallest to smallest.
