### LITERACY

Children will continue recount writing and develop their narrative writing skills. Children will be learning one new phoneme each week as well as four new common words. Children will be continuing to develop their fluency and expand their knowledge on nouns and comprehension as well as developing their handwriting by joining letters.



### NUMERACY

The children are exploring place value within 2 and 3 digit numbers. Children will be using a range of concrete and abstract materials to visualize numbers, count on and count back in sequence and partition numbers. Children will be developing their knowledge of 2D and 3D shape this term as well as developing skills and strategies to add and subtract numbers to 1000.

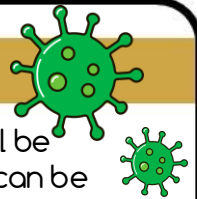
### OVERVIEW OF TERM
