Last term the children learned to play hockey and they will build on this experience by demonstrating their skills in golf. They will also develop their skills learning to play tennis.




The children will combine their PE and expressive skills as they learn some simple dance routines.

Literacy



This term, our main focus is on improving reading fluency and accuracy as we explore non-fiction texts. Please encourage your child to read for enjoyment at home.

In class, the children will work on their comprehension and summarising when reading texts. They will develop their skim and scan skills as they read for information.

They will continue to enhance their writing as we focus on independent writing. They will be creating various narrative texts. Accurate punctuation, spelling, and grammar will be emphasised throughout this process.



The children will enhance their skills through digital technology by learning to use laptops and becoming acquainted with the QWERTY keyboard.
