Health and Wellbeing.

There is a strong commitment by staff to Health and Wellbeing. This year all staff have been involved in training in Getting it Right for Every Child, to ensure that children and their families get the right support when it is needed.

The S1 Pupil Council, supported by the school's Home School Partnership Officer, produced a 'Welcome to our School Community' DVD to help prepare primary 7 children for their transition to Saint Ambrose. This DVD was well received by both the children and their parents.

March 2014 saw a very successful health event for S3. The day began with a talk from a B-eat Young Ambassador as part of Eating Disorders Awareness Week. Thereafter pupils were involved in a variety of workshops including relaxation, sleep, personal safety, alcohol and drug awareness, and cycling.

In May all of S1 were involved in a 'Fun, Food & Fitness' day, linked to the importance of healthy eating and keeping active. Feedback from pupils indicated that the event encouraged 70% of the year group to think more about their diet, with 89% saying they would like to be more active!

GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP

During June pupils and staff are involved in a variety of foreign excursions as part of their wider curriculum. This includes the participation of three pupils and one staff member who are currently in Malawi as part of NLC Healthy Lifestyles.

A member of staff and two S6 pupils are taking part in the Scottish Partnership with our partner school in Bangalore.

In commemoration of the Allied Invasion of Normandy a group of 35 pupils and 5 staff are visiting the Belgian Battlefields and finally on the last week of term a party of pupils and staff will take part in

The 2014 NLC Parents' Conference was held in St Ambrose High School on Saturday, 29 March. This year's keynote speaker was the Executive Director, Andrew Sutherland, who outlined his vision for education in North Lanarkshire.

Information sessions were offered on a range of topics including assessment, the new national qualifications, higher order thinking skills, positive behaviour strategies, writing in the primary school and physical education

The New National Qualification session proved to be very popular and was delivered by the SQA Curriculum for Excellence Liaison Manager. He outlined the structure and design of the new National Qualifications in Scotland stating that:

- The fresh approach to learning under Curriculum for Excellence requires new assessment methods and qualifications.
- The new National Qualifications that are being developed will have equal status and credibility to those currently available and will support the new curriculum.

The conference was an opportunity for Parents to learn about key aspects of education and to contribute their views on Education within North Lanarkshire.





