As you all know, there are ongoing concerns about the impact and spread of the Coronavirus. I have included some information within our Newsletter as per the updates I have received from the Scottish Government and NHS Scotland, via North Lanarkshire Council. Please read this and encourage your child (ren) to take some of the simple steps necessary to prevent the spread of germs. Much of this is/should be routine, but we all know that not all children are the best at washing their hands properly and regularly!

There will be challenging and complicated times ahead but I know that, if we all communicate and cooperate, then the best possible outcome will be reached. Our focus continues to be on Learning & Teaching and keeping our community safe.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/CARERS

As you are well aware, our school remains open and children should attend as normal unless the following applies (these are national guidelines):

- 1. If your child has a headache, persistent cough or a high temperature, they should not attend school and should "self isolate" for a period of **14 days.** If one family member has symptoms, the whole family should isolate.
- 2. If your child reports any of these symptoms at school, we will contact you immediately and will fully expect that you or an appointed adult will collect your child as soon as possible.
- 3. If your child has any underlying health issues, you should seek advice from your GP or NHS24. Apart from the obvious concerns around Coronavirus, we currently have a large number of children who have had Sickness and Diahorrea over the last week. Children should not return to school until **48 hours** after their last episode.

AS FAR AS POSSIBLE MAKE CONTACT WITH US VIA TELEPHONE/EMAIL

To avoid unnecessary face-to-face contact, we ask that you make enquiries via telephone or email. A member of the Senior Leadership Team or a relevant member of staff will return your call/email if it is not possible to speak to you when you call. As you know, we operate an open door policy. However, for the time being, we will have an open line policy instead!

We will be limiting visitors into school to avoid any unnecessary contact with people who are not essential to the ongoing running of the school. No new appointments/meetings will be made until further notice.

WE WILL CONTINUE TO PROVIDE UPDATES AS AND WHEN WE HAVE THEM

Our School App and Website will be the main means of communication between school and home. We will use Facebook and Twitter to direct you to this information, but to avoid unnecessary speculation, the main information will be given through the App and/ or Website. This enables you to download letters and documents, etc.

Official announcements are only made under the direction of North Lanarkshire Council. It is important that EVERYONE receives the same messages at the same time. This keeps everyone informed and on an even footing.

WILL THE SCHOOL CLOSE?

The situation is under constant review and North Lanarkshire Council, along with NHS Lanarkshire/Scotland follow advice from the Scottish and UK Governments. The school will not close unless a directive is made by the Scottish Government and/or NLC.

You will be the first to know if such an announcement is to be made, but we remain open and look forward to welcoming the children each day. Please do not pay attention to unofficial information.

CANCELLATION OF MEETINGS, TRIPS, EVENTS AND CLUBS

So far, we have had to cancel the Dance Competition, The Choir Festival, The Youth Music Initiative Concert and the following:

- ◆ ALL AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS. This is to allow our Teaching Staff the time to focus on planning for Learning and Teaching.
- ALL PLANNED TRIPS & EXCURSIONS. We have some trips planned which we have been advised to cancel by NLC. Any refunds will be offered ASAP.
- PARENT HELPERS & PARENT MEETINGS. NLC have advised us to avoid all unnecessary face-to-face contact.
- CARDINAL NEWMAN LINKS. None of the planned transition events will take place.
- PLANNED NURSERY ACTIVITIES. Sponsored walk, Zumba, Football will not take place.
- ALL SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES.

DRAMA CLUB UPDATE

With the cancellation of Drama Club, we may be unable to stage a production later in the school year. Obviously, if the children are not rehearsing, they cannot work towards a performance. However, we will take things into consideration and perhaps try to arrange rehearsals during the school day for the next few weeks. By that time, we may know more and have a clearer picture from the Government. This is another HUGE disappointment for the children, yourselves and obviously the staff who put so much of their time and enthusiasm into this.

MOTHER'S DAY ASSEMBLY - CANCELLED

This year's Mother's Day Assembly is unfortunately cancelled. This is part of our measures to reduce unnecessary gatherings within the school campus. Whilst this is a real disappointment to you all, I am sure that you understand the reasons behind this cancellation.

Thank you to our P1 children and our P1 staff who have already put in so much effort to prepare for this event. It is a disappointment to us all!

FIRST CONFESSION - CANCELLED

Children from St Columba's Parish are due to make their First Confession on 30th March 2020 in the church. However, following discussion with Father Bogan, it has been decided to **CANCEL** this event. Our P3 children are all prepared and ready to make this Sacrament. Therefore, an arrangement will be made with Fr Bogan and the school so that the children can make their Confession in the coming week. Unfortunately, no Parents/Carers will be invited to join us. Rest assured, we will make this a special occasion for the children.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Our Primary 4 children are due to make their First Communion in May. I know that Parents/Carers have approached both Parish Priests and certainly I have also been approached. It is too early to say if Communions will be cancelled, as we do not know what decisions will be made about social/religious gatherings. Keep the prayers going for a speedy end to all of this please! We will keep in contact with our Parish Priests in the coming weeks and will publish any information as soon as we have it.

REPORTING TO PARENTS

You may remember from our previous Newsletter in August/September that we have slightly changed the order of when and how we report to you. Within the next two weeks, you will receive a written report for your child(ren) from their Class Teacher. This is instead of sending such reports out in June. To end the school year, a Parents' Evening will be held in early June. Myself and Mrs Martin are currently working through the reports and adding our own comments. LENTEN FUNDRAISING DAY - FRIDAY 27TH MARCH 2020



and to do what Jesus tells us:


He who took our sufferings upon Himself, and bore our sorrows to bring us, through the Cross, to the joy of the Resurrection. Amen.

THE RESULTS ARE IN AND THEY ARE VERY GOOD!

Last week, we received the final report from HMIe and Care Inspectorate following the inspection which took place on 11th—13th November 2019. The links to this were circulated to you through our school App, social media and our school website. A summary of the report



is attached to this Newsletter, however, I would encourage you to use the links on the summary, as this gives a much more details account of the findings.

The fact that HMIe rated the standard of *Learning, Teaching and Assessment* as **VERY GOOD** is a huge achievement and is testimony to the hard work and dedication of our entire staff team. This is a fantastic endorsement of what we are working towards as a school community, with all parents/carers and partners having our children at the centre of all that we do. Our work towards *Raising Attainment and Achievement* was graded as **GOOD**, which is also a great endorsement of our work around the Scottish Attainment Challenge and our efforts to ensure that all children continue to achieve. The inspectors particularly commented on the fact that **EQUITY** was at the heart of our school; meaning all children have a variety of experiences, opportunities and supports available to them supported by careful planning and close monitoring of progress and achievement.

Our Nursery Class were graded as **GOOD** for both Learning & Teaching and Raising Attainment & Achievement. We are very proud of their achievements. They also had an inspection by Care Inspectorate during the same week. For both areas they were inspected on, they were graded as **VERY GOOD** with no recommendations to take forward. This is a wonderful achievement!

Our journey of improvement does not stop here, however! We are not complacent and we know there are always areas for improvement and development.

In particular, I want to thank our children and staff for the way in which they welcomed this inspection with open arms! We were ready for this. We had been preparing for this. I also want to thank all of our Parents/Carers for their contribution and support, which is so valued and so important to us.

In support of North Lanarkshire Council's ambition to continue improvement in parental communications and its broader Digital NL plans we have been working with national organisations to develop a "Parents Portal".

The portal has been and will continue to be developed to provide parents with a clear insight to their child's education and to support transactional communications between parents and the school, this includes attendance, reports and school information.

The development was piloted last session in a small number of schools, when it was within its first phase. Since then more features have been added and North Lanarkshire has moved forward its own digital communication

This first phase will introduce basic information about the school and include services such as

- general school information

As the development of the Portal continues, it is hoped to add features such as reporting absences and permission slips for excursions, etc.



Once APPROVED you can access the PORTAL.
