What are we learning about in Nursery this month?

Happy New Year from the Tollbrae Nursery team!

As it is Burns Day on the 25th, we are learning about Scotland and Scottish and Gaelic culture across the whole school. This month, Nursery boys and girls will be finding out about Scottish symbols including the Saltire, tartan and thistles and will learn and listen to simple traditional Scottish and Gaelic songs and rhymes. At the end of the month, we will enjoy a wee Burns Supper. Children will be encouraged to try traditional Scottish foods and drinks such as haggis, neeps and tatties, shortbread, tablet and Irn Bru. They will also have the opportunity to try their hand playing bagpipes! If you have any more ideas for helping children to learn more about Scottish and Gaelic culture – we would love to hear them.

We are also having a very active start to 2017 in Nursery. Each week, we will try our hand at a different Scottish sport including shinty, curling and Highland Games.
