February 2016	Stage	What's going on in your child's class?
	<b>P1a</b>	<p>Primary 1a have settled back into school well after our Christmas break. We have been working hard to develop our reading skills and can now read with some great expression. We have also been learning how to write instructions and know that we have to include a title, a list of materials and all our instructions have to be in the right order. In Maths, we have been learning how to count on and back and have been exploring adding more. We have enjoyed finding out a little bit about Scotland. We researched some facts about Robert Burns, listened to some Scottish music, tasted some delicious Scottish food and drew some symbols of Scotland. We have also really enjoyed learning how to dance the Virginia Reel in gym. We are looking forward to starting our block of gymnastics and exploring our local community.</p>
	<b>P1b</b>	<p>Primary 1b have been very busy learning lots since our return to school this year. We have explored different Scottish symbols and we had great fun tasting Scottish foods. We have learned to write instructions and are learning to spell new words every week! We have 5 Learn Its now, and we have enjoyed singing a song to help us learn them. We have also been investigating adding using salt dough, cubes, pegs and lots of other interesting things. We are looking forward to exploring out local area in the next few weeks.</p>
	<b>P2</b>	<p>Primary 2 have been working very hard since coming back to school after Christmas. We have been practicing spelling our words correctly and are delighted with our weekly scores. We have also had good scores for our "Big Maths" Beat That tests. We are learning our Scottish Poem "The Crocodile" by JK Annand and putting actions to this. We have also been learning about Scottish Castles, Cities and Rivers. In Maths we are counting money to 20 pence and next week count money to 50 pence. We are also learning the number story to 13 and can add and subtract within this number. A wee reminder to say that PE for P2 is on Mondays and Thursdays, Monday is outdoor gym and Thursday is indoor gym. We have been practising the "Circle Jig" on Thursdays but also working on gymnastics and full PE kit is safer on the equipment. Many thanks for your continued support in sending PE kit.</p>
	<b>P2/3</b>	<p>Primary 2/3 have been very busy learning all about Scottish Food. They enjoyed a tasting session and tried a range of foods, they then recorded their likes and dislikes. In Maths they continue to work hard with their daily CLIC programme and are learning all about using £1 and 20p coins. Very soon they will be starting their new topic "A Victorian Child". Please keep checking the P2/3 blog to see the fantastic work taking place in their classroom.</p>
	<b>P3</b>	<p>Primary 3 have settled back well into school after the Christmas holidays. We have been getting to know our new teacher, Mrs Finlay, and she has been getting to know us. We have worked together to write our own class contract about how to work and play safe, hard and fair in school. In Maths we have been learning about money - coin combinations to make a certain amount and calculating change when paying for items. We have also been continuing to practise our Learn It's and doubling 2 digit numbers. We have had fun learning more about Scotland too.</p> <p>We have learned about Scottish produce and have tasted a variety of Scottish foods. We have also learned and performed Scottish poetry and Scottish dancing. We have also written our own poems about Scotland, after discussing and watching footage of life in the highlands, islands, lochs and cities.</p>
	<b>P4</b>	<p>Primary 4 have been learning about the significant Scot, John Logie Baird. We have been fascinated by how his inventions have changed the world as we know it today. We also learned a lot about Robert Burns and have enjoyed learning our Scots' Poem, 'Lament for a Lost Dinner Ticket' by Margaret Hamilton. We are excited to perform it to the school at our Scottish Assembly. Remember to check our blog updates as we will post a video of our performance.</p>
	<b>P4/5</b>	<p>So far this term we have been learning about Scotland. We learned about the famous Scottish poet, Robert Burns, we tasted some different traditional Scottish foods and we also learned facts about some Scottish animals. We really enjoyed tasting the different foods and trying some new things! We had a great time practising for our Scottish assembly and enjoyed learning the words and creating a dance for 'Donald Where's Your Troosers'! Have a look on our blog to see our performance! This term we also started a block of Food Technology lessons and we are very excited to be cooking some different foods!</p>
	<b>P5</b>	<p>Primary Five have been very busy learning our poem for the Scottish Assembly. We have also been learning about the life of Robert Burns and what happens at a Burns Supper. This term we have also been investigating the River Clyde and the shipbuilding that took place along it. Remember to keep checking our blog to see what else we have been up to!</p>
	<b>P5/6</b>	<p>This month we have been very busy. We have been learning all about Scottish society in the past and present. We had an amazing trip to The People's Palace which gave us the opportunity to see first hand what it was like to live in the past. We are also taking part in the whole school Burn's competition which we are very excited about!</p>
	<b>P6</b>	<p>The children of P6 recently finished a mini-topic on Scotland where they interviewed family members about Scottish childhood and schools in the past and visited The People's Palace where they learned more about our local culture and history. In Maths the children are learning about decimals in context e.g. looking at money, weight and distances. They will be going on to learn about Influential People for an interdisciplinary topic.</p>
	<b>P7</b>	<p>Primary Seven are settling back into their third term. In Maths we have been working on division and long division. We have been reading and creating our own Scottish poems using Scottish dialect! We have been looking at the work of Charles Rennie Mackintosh and used his style to create our own pieces of art work including a lampshade. In P.E we have enjoyed learning various Scottish country dances with everyone participating enthusiastically. Some pupils from both classes represented the school at the Sports Hall Event final, everyone tried their best and enjoyed the experience. The remainder of the children took part in a challenge afternoon and showed that they were able to work as part of a team. The children have set themselves health and Wellbeing targets around improving their healthy lifestyle. Dojos will be given for healthy snack choices!</p>
