Please remember to phone into the school office before 9.30am if your child is absent. This is mainly for the safety of all children but also ensures your child receives the correct absence mark. Parents who have not called in for their child will receive a text from the school requesting a phone call. If we don't receive a call in reply to this text your child will be marked as unauthorised.

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Could you please ensure your child has their gym kit on their gym days? Increasingly children are coming to school without it. If you are unsure of your child's gym days please call the office and they will be able to help.

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For children who come to Breakfast Club can you please ensure they have sufficient funds on their card to cover breakfast and lunch (if they go to school dinners)? Increasingly children don't seem to have sufficient funds on their card and the money is having to be covered by the office. Unfortunately, this cannot be sustained. Your co-operation is appreciated.

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If your child has an appointment during school hours the school should be informed of the appointment in writing with a copy of the appointment letter/slip included. This will ensure children are given the correct absence mark.

It was a great turnout and the pupils were fantastic showing parents, grandparent, Aunts, Uncles and friends what they have been learning in Primary 1. March 2016	Stage	What's going on in your child's class?
	P1a	Primary 1a have had a very busy term. We have been working very hard on our reading and are starting to write our own super sentences. We have been learning how to add and subtract and we now know 7 Learn Its! Through our topic we have found out about some of the people who can help us. We learned that dentists look after our teeth, doctors help us feel better when we are sick and firemen help to put out fires. We really enjoyed having two Police Officers come to visit us too! In gymnastics we have been perfecting our rolling, jumping and balancing skills.
	P1b	March has been a very busy month for Primary 1b. The children have all been working really hard to develop their reading and writing skills and gaining confidence every day! We have explored subtraction and have also been learning about number stories at Maths time. P.E. time has been fun and challenging as the children have developed their balancing, jumping and rolling. The boys and girls have also been investigating the local area and had great fun learning about the people who help them. One of the highlights was a visit from two local Police Officers. Thank you to everyone who came along to our showcase afternoon. The children did a great job of sharing all the things that they have leaned with parents and friends.
	P2	Primary 2 have been busy completing our topic on "People Who Help To Keep Us Safe." One of our homework tasks was to make a model of an emergency vehicle. The children who have completed this task have done so to a very high standard. The models are proudly displayed in the classroom and we have commented on the great ideas used to complete each one. They look fabulous. Well done. We are busy in Maths multiplying by 2 and 3. We have also been learning to divide by 2, realising that this is like halving a number. We enjoyed running the mile for Sports Relief and P.O.L.O. Day very much. We are now going to try to complete the "Daily Mile" challenge. Everyone has worked very hard this term and we are looking forward to the Spring break very much.
	P2/3	Primary 2/3 enjoyed their P.O.L.O Day, powering off and learning outdoors. They are now more aware of how they can use their natural environment to learn. Primary 2/3 have had a fantastic term learning all about Victorian children. They have learned about rich and poor children, work and school. They recently experienced what it would be like to attend a Victorian school. All children thoroughly enjoyed this experience and it was made even more realistic with their costumes, a huge thank you and well done to all of you who helped with this. Your support is greatly appreciated. Primary three have now finished their 'Victorian Child' topic. We have enjoyed learning about the types
	P3	of jobs poor children had to do, such as a chimney sweep, factory worker or street seller. We also learned all about what it was like to go to school in Victorian times if you were a rich child. We ended the topic with a Role play day, giving the children an experience of what it would have been like in a Victorian school. The classroom was transformed. The children practised the 3 R's. They wrote on slates with chalk and tried their hand at cursive writing in their copy book. They learned facts about Queen Victoria, history of previous monarchs and named capital cities, as well as experiencing 'drill'. They also experienced how strict Victorian teachers would have been. The children were quite taken aback by this and many of them did not like this aspect of the day. However, at the end of the day we were all transported back to the present day and we all had had a great experience.
	P4	Primary 4 have enjoyed learning about Fractions, and taken part in many active learning opportunities to ensure their understanding. Our Outdoor Learning is progressing well and we recently planted onions and leeks that will grow to allow us to create lovely salads and soup mixes in the fourth term. In term 4 we are excited to try to work more independently as we near the end of Primary 4, and we strive to meet our learning targets.
	P4/5	This month we started our new novel study 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. So far we have enjoyed learning about the different characters and we are looking forward to learning about Charlie's journey through the wonderful chocolate factory! We also started our new 'Wonka Wonders' theme in IDL and have been investigating some important inventions of our time - we can't wait to start creating some inventions of our own. In Maths we came to the end of our Fractions topic and rounded it off by creating some delicious fractions pizzas using thirds and sixths - check out our blog to see some of our pictures.
	P5	Primary 5 have been very busy this term learning all about fractions and percentages and discussing where we use them in our lives. We have also started a new topic about Inventions where we will be looking at some famous inventors and even have the chance to do some inventing ourselves. Keep an eye on the blog to see some of our inventions!
	P5/6	Primary 5/6 have been learning all about Substance Misuse. We know the impact that the misuse of substances has on families and friends. We can also identify the risks associated with the misuse of both legal and illegal drugs. We have made posters to let others know the risks involved with using drugs, smoking ladded and alcohol and have displayed them in the school.
	P6	P.O.L.O. Day was a huge success for Primary 6! The children all rated the day as very good or a fantastic learning experience in their evaluations and particularly enjoyed the messy mud art and learning about nature through spending time outdoors. As buddies for the new P1s from August, the P6s were happy to meet and help their buddy at an induction day in March. The children produced some fantastic personal projects on various influential people ranging from Andy Murray and Nicola Sturgeon to John Logie Baird. Well done!

P7

Primary 7 have been busy learning all about bio diversity and working out and reflecting on their own carbon footprint. In Maths we have been learning names of angles and their properties as well as learning how to use protractors to calculate angles accurately. We have been creating our own dance routines in P.E, reflecting on seventies moves in keeping with Whitelees 40th Birthday. We enjoyed the recent P.O.L.O day which gave real meaning to our bio diversity topic. We are looking forward to our trip to Kilbowie, please ensure you have returned all necessary paperwork.
