## Monthly Attendance - January 2017

Regular attendance at school is important and has been proven to be linked to improved achievements! Here's how our statistics are looking this month:

Average Attendance: 96.51%

Number achieving 100% Attendance: 76

Average Latecoming: 35.76% of children have 1 or more instances of latecoming

15.89% of children have 3 or more instances of latecoming 12 children have more than 10 or more instances of latecoming

As you will see, our instances of latecoming has increased again since last month. This is a major concern and something which we are keen to work on. Arriving late to class not only affects the late child's learning but also that of the rest of the class.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone of our Mobile Phone Policy. We would rather children didn't bring expensive mobile phones to school but we understand parents may feel reassured that they can contact their child and more importantly their child can contact them should the necessity arise on the journey to and from school. To this end we have a policy that all mobile phones should be switched off once children arrive in the school playground and they MUST not be used to take photographs within the school playground or building. Once in class mobile phones should be handed into their class teacher and they will be kept at the office during the day until before 3.00pm when they will be returned to the classes. Could we request that you ensure your child knows what our mobile policy is? Thank you for your continued support.



### School Lunch

Could you please ensure your child has enough money on their card to cover their lunch. Increasingly the dinner school are sending notes home to parents whose children don't have enough money on their card for lunch.

#### Breakfast Club

Our Breakfast Club runs every day from 8.15am and costs 20p per day. The cost of the Club is deducted from the pupils' dinner card. The money must be provided either before or on the day. Could you please ensure your child has sufficient funds on their card for Breakfast Club, increasingly children are coming to the office for money and this is not being returned? I'm sure you will understand that this cannot be sustained.

If your child attends Breakfast Club please ensure they enter the building through the middle door of the playground in order to be registered.

All pupils are welcome, there is no need to pre-book!

February	Stage	What's going on in your child's class?
2017	P1a	Primary 1 have had a very busy start to 2017. We have had great fun learning about Robert Burns and enjoyed celebrating his birthday with a Burns Supper. We made shortbread, neeps and tatties and we got to taste Irn Bru and haggis too! We have learned new sounds and spelling words this term and we are also learning to write Instructions. Our counting skills are improving all the time and we are becoming experts at counting on and back. We have developed our cutting, tearing and sticking skills and have created some lovely collage art work.
P2		In Primary two we have been learning all about Robert Burns and his poetry. We learned some Scots words and even wrote our own poem in the style of Burns called 'To a pound' with lots of rhyming words including some of our spelling words. We also learned a fun traditional song 'You cannie shove your granny aff the bus', something none of us would ever do of course. We also made some 3D Scottish thistles to decorate our class with. We have started our new class topic, Our Local Area where we are going to learn about Scotland and our own town.
	P2/3	Primary 2/3 have been enjoying learning about Scotland and I have loved reading the interesting facts the children have been writing for famous Scots. In Maths, the children have been developing their skills in measure and are working well together to investigate weight. They are making good progress with their writing and have been working hard to write instructions and poetry after learning about Robert Burns. The children are looking forward to learning about Knights and Castles this term.
P3		Primary 3 have been enjoying learning about Scotland, we have explored our national dress and made beautiful kilts with sporrans. We made the tartan designs for the kilts using the wheels of toy cars to create different coloured lines. (thank you for the old car donations). Pupils have chosen to learn about animals that are native to Scotland and this led us to investigate Scotland's national animal, a great surprise! We have been inspired by the artist Steven Brown's McCoo art and have produced our own examples using different textures and materials. We have also been exploring Scottish dialect through poetry, pupils have created some wonderful poetry which we have had fun reading. Primary 3 gave a very confident performance at our Burns assembly. In Maths we are beginning to learn about time, while also continuing with our Big Maths learning. We will be beginning our next topic Castle Life with a focus on Stirling Castle, comparing life in the past to life today.
	P4	Poets, Scientists, Engineers, Explorers and Doctors. P4 have been learning about famous Scots and the impact they've made on us and Scottish culture. The children did a great job learning An Address to the Toothache and recited it beautifully at our Scottish assembly. For the next few weeks the children will be learning more about individuals that have shaped Scottish society. They will be learning more about time and number patterns too. Please check the blog for changes to PE times.
	P4/5	Primary 4/5 have been learning about famous Scots as part of their class topic. During Scottish week, we learned about Robert Burns life and how Burns day is celebrated. The class enjoyed performing 'Bonnie Wee Jeannie McColl' at our Scottish assembly. A class full of fantastic singers!! We are now looking at Scottish inventors and how they have had an impact on our society. Pupils have been carrying out lots of interesting research. In Maths, we have been learning how to read and tell the time so we can use these skills every day!
	P5	P5 have settled back into a new term and are working very hard. This term we are working with Brian in our outdoor area and have already been very busy preparing planters and planting garlic. We are looking forward to planting some vegetables over the next few weeks which we will then get to taste. We have also been learning about Scotland and how we use renewable energy. In Maths, we have been investigating grid reference and we are now looking at giving directions using compass points. Remember to keep checking the blog to see what we have been doing!
	P5/6	Primary 5/6 have been thoroughly enjoying researching and learning all about Scottish artists. They have produced some beautiful artwork in the style of Charles Rennie Mackintosh, Jack Vettriano, Henry Raeburn and John Lowrie Morrison. The children also performed successfully at the Burns Assembly. Very proud teachers!
		They have been busy improving the mental recall of their learn it's! Well done for challenging yourself boys and girls! Keep it up!
		The children have been participating in science experiments with a specialist Science Teacher. Ask them why our classroom smells of vinegar!
		The best news so farMrs McAuley has welcomed a beautiful, bouncing baby boy into her family! Congratulations Mrs McAuley!

P6	Primary 6 have been working very hard in the first few weeks of the term. They learned the poem "Sam the Skull" for our Scottish assembly last Friday, which they performed extremely well and were voted the best by the school. Well done P6.
	We have been studying time in Maths, digital times, 12 hour, 24 hour, timetables and intervals of time. Next, we move onto Fractions. We are also looking at the customs and traditions of Chinese New Year in RME and our new topic will be "Titanic - The Unsinkable Ship". We will be looking at this topic from a Technology perspective but also looking at the timeline of events and history of the ship. Homework continues as before with words and challenges changing fortnightly. PE days are Mondays for Indoor PE and Thursdays for Outdoor PE. PE is first thing on a Monday morning so having the children already dressed in their PE kit saves valuable teaching and learning time. Thank you for your continued support.
P6/7	P6/7 are settled back into the routines of school and are preparing for the hard working term ahead. In Maths we have been completing our time unit and are beginning long multiplication, multiplying up to 4/5 digit numbers by 2 and 3 digits! We are enjoying our class reading books and are developing our literacy skills through this, P6 are reading a book which even gives big clues as to our next topic, we wonder what that could be? We are learning about Oban as part of our Scottish IDL topic, we are using mapping skills and research to learn more about this Scottish town that P7 will be visiting when we go to Kilbowie this month. We are excited to begin our ICT topic on internet safety, and have already produced some fantastic Internet awareness posters as part of our homework.
P7	Primary 7 have had a settled start to the new term and have been working harder than ever! Our thoughts are turning to our adventures to come in Kilbowie at the end of the month and we are preparing ourselves with tasks which develop our team work, decision making and coping skills. In Maths we completed our block on time and have been working on long multiplication with great success! Our story writing is developing and we are working on inference and similes. Lots of children have been pushing themselves whether it be on improving presentation, increased participation, working with others or using the tools they need to improve and learn. A great start to a busy term.
