Monthly Attendance - March 2017

Regular attendance at school is important and has been proven to be linked to improved achievements! Here's how our statistics are looking this month:

Average Attendance: 96.47%

Number achieving 100% Attendance: 61

Average Latecoming: 39.75% of children have 1 or more instances of latecoming

17.88% of children have 3 or more instances of latecoming 16 children have more than 10 or more instances of latecoming

As you will see, our instances and average latecoming have increased again since last month. This is a major concern and something which we are keen to work on. Arriving late to class not only affects the late child's learning but also that of the rest of the class.

Absence Policy

If your child has a medical/dental appointment during the school day please advise our office staff by handing in the appointment letter which they will copy for our records. It is vitally important that we are informed of all appointments during the course of the school day as this will ensure your child receives the correct absence mark.

Parents and carers are reminded to inform the school office before 9.30am if your child is unable to attend from the start of the school day on the first day of absence. Failure to do so will result in school staff sending a text to the main contact provided for the child. This is important for child safety and also ensures your child receives the correct absence mark.


Parents and carers are required to inform the school by letter or telephone if their child is likely to be absent for some time, and to give the child a note on his or her return to school confirming the reason for absence.

Due to the success of last year's event the Book Fair is returning to Whitelees again this year and will be here next week! Your child has already been given a leaflet detailing all the books for sale!

March	Stage	What's going on in your child's class?
2017	P1	Primary 1 have been enjoying learning about the Vikings. We have learned what Viking houses looked like and what clothes they wore. We have enjoyed experimenting with clay to create some beautiful Viking brooches. Our number skills keep getting better and better and we can now solve addition and subtraction sums, explaining how we found our answer. In Literacy we have been writing some super imaginative stories about Vikings. We are trying hard to use connectives to add more detail to our sentences.
	P2	In primary 2 we have been learning about our local area, looking at maps and learning the compass points, North, South, East and West. We have also been learning about Judaism and hearing stories about Moses. We are working hard at our Maths to make our mental agility lightning quick. We have even made a rap to remember some of the rules in our Phonemes, it must be working as Mr Campbell is very happy with our spelling test scores.
	P2/3	As always, Primary 2/3 have been working very hard. The children are really enjoying learning about Castles. We had a great time on our trip to Abronhill Library and have come back with some fantastic books to help us with our research. The children are developing their computer skills using the laptops and iPads to find out more about castles. The children have just completed fantastic art using pastels, where they created their own version of Paul Klee's 'Castle and Sun' and they are going to look wonderful in our cloakroom. In Maths, we are continuing to work on measure and we are now focusing on length. The children are enjoying working together to measure and I am very impressed with their estimating skills! We have been reading non-fiction and learning lots of new things through our texts.
	P3	Primary 3 have started exploring life in the past through our Castle life topic, we are comparing aspects of life in the past to life today. Pupils have chosen to explore; clothing, daily life, dwellings and food. We have also been learning about Heraldry and pupils have created their own shield and flag designs. In art pupils have experienced modelling with clay and have created Thumb Pots which have been painted to match their chosen heraldry colours. In Maths we are continuing to learn about time and develop our skills in reading and writing both analogue and digital forms and using this knowledge to solve problems. Pupils have researched facts about Chinese New Year and have used this information to write a poem. We are continuing to work hard to develop our writing skills, our focus has been on developing description to add detail and more interest to our writing.
	P4	In P4 we're looking forward to two main events in March. Our class trip to Burns Cottage to learn about the Bard and to welcoming parents to our Scottish showcase at 2.15pm on the 2nd of March. The children have been learning to subtract 3 digit numbers using the vertical method. They have been learning the differences between weather and climate and comparing both of these measures for Scotland and Australia. PE days are now on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
	P4/5	Primary 4/5 have thoroughly enjoyed exploring the outdoors with Brian. This week, we learned how to take cuttings from plants and use this to grow new plants! In Maths, we are learning about the importance of money and how we can pay and give change. We have also finished our topic on famous Scots. We can't wait to share our learning during our open afternoon next week! We look forward to seeing you!
	P5	P5 have been working in our outdoor environment planting a variety of plants and vegetables. We are hoping it will not be too long until we get to taste something! In Maths, we have been learning about time and how to read a timetable. Our focus in science has been inherited characteristics and we have been researching how certain characteristics are linked to survival and extinction. We have also enjoyed taking part in our Lepra event this term and are looking forward to lots of fun events in the next few weeks! Remember to keep check Twitter and the Blog!
	P5/6	This term we are excited to learn about the Titanic, when she was built and the jobs done by workers e.g. welders and riveters. Some of us have built fantastic models and we are doing artwork showing the Titanic sinking. In language we are continuing to practice to write beautifully as well as developing our fluency and reading with expression. We have fun during mental Maths practicing our times tables. Primary 5 are learning to divide with remainders while primary 6 are beginning to learn negative numbers.
	P6	We are enjoying our topic "Titanic", finding out lots of interesting facts about the ship. In Maths we have been learning about fractions, equivalent fractions and how to simplify fractions. Next we move onto decimals and percentages. We are continuing to work hard on our reading and daily writing tasks. We are enjoying the expertise of Mr Smyth who is an art teacher from the Academy coming to help us with our Art work. We look forward to displaying our prints very soon.
	P6/7	Primary 6/7 are diving head first into their new topic, 'The Titanic'. They have been learning all about the rights of 1st and 3rd class passengers, building up to discussing and evaluating whether the class system was responsible for the severity of the Titanic disaster in 1912. In Maths we have been learning all about co-ordinates. Primary 6 have been using this learning to create co-ordinate drawings of the Titanic. P7 have used these skills to locate the Titanic's journey and resting place on a map, and finding out whether the Carpathia or California should have come to the rescue based on map distance.
	P7	Primary 7 have been learning all about Oban and applying this knowledge across the curriculum using their co-ordinates knowledge to track journeys between Cumbernauld and Oban. In literacy we have been working using inference in our writing with fantastic results. We have been learning about the divisions that sectarianism can cause and developing our art skills creating images with foreground and background.
