

Scottish Topic: 'Donald Where's Your Troosers?'

January is a special month in Scotland as we celebrate the famous poet Robbie Burns. One of the ways we celebrate is by having Burns Supper. In this Scottish topic lesson you are going to learn about a song written by Andy Stewart called 'Donald Where's Your Troosers?'

2. Answer the questions on 'Donald Where's Your Troosers' on the worksheet provided.

'Donald Where's Your Troosers' is a song written by Andy Stewart (1960–1989). Andy Stewart wrote the words to the song and Neil Grant wrote the music. The song is meant to be funny and is about the reaction Donald gets when he wears a kilt instead of a pair of trousers.

Try joining in on the chorus: *'Let the wind blow high, let the wind blow low. Through the streets with my kilt I go. All the lassies say: "Hello, Donald's whaur's yer troosers?"*
