#### School Development




At the end of last term our parents fed back that we could focus on improving communication this year:

- We are very glad to say we have Seesaw renewed and up and running once more. The cost of Seesaw has quadrupled this year, so we hope to use it successfully and improve our communication as a result.
- Admin will continue to use emails for all core information and texts for emergency closures.
- We have dates for the diary for the year ahead on the school website, and we update these regularly.
- We will create a termly newsletter showing the breadth of learning and the highlights to give everyone a taster
  of what the school is doing across all the classes.
- We will have 2 progress meetings in the year with parents and carers. We have one consultation meeting in November and the second is in March.

- We will add evaluated pieces of work to the Progress and Attainment folder in Seesaw, which will give you the level your child is working at and what their next steps are. This will have a few pieces each term for continuous reporting.
- There will be an end of year progress report with the levels of attainment. The art, music and PE teachers will give comments which are personal to your child as part of that report.
- We will have assemblies for our whole school community and for our parents and carers.
- We will meet regularly with the Parent Council as a body of parents who represent the whole parent forum. At these meetings we share our progress as a school and ask for parent's opinions when we are making decision about the school. #### In-Service

### Opportunities for personal achievement

We award a weekly Star of the Week focusing on personal achievements during the week.

P1/2/3 have regular opportunities for Show and Tell and diary writing, sharing their achievements outside school with the rest of the class e.g. involvement in sports, dancing, horse riding

Pupils have opportunities to share their writing with the class and have their IDL art and craft activities displayed in the classroom.

All P1s received certificates for a positive start to P1 and had their photo taken for the paper.

#### Interdisciplinary Learning

This term we have been learning about Ourselves, focusing on families, homes, the human body and senses.

We have connected to the world of work through our Doctors role play area.

As part of our exploration of fairy tales we have taken part in a variety of craft experiences.

We have used data handling skills to gather and share information about ourselves, for example eye colour and favourite fruit or colour.

All P1/2/3s have joined Pupil Groups providing the opportunity to contribute to school developments.

We have attended school assemblies focusing on the Aims of the school - Ready, Respectful, Safe. Creating images to show how we van be ready, respectful speech bubbles and Hi Vis Vest to show how we can be safe.

We created a display for the school of Bee Ready, Bee, Respectful and Bee Safe.

P1 are settling into the life and routines of the school and P2/3 pupils have helped with inclusion through partner work and by setting a good example.

This term our writing focus is fairy tales, retelling the story, creating our own versions and developing characters.

We are developing Reading for Pleasure with a designated reading area in the classroom and regular access to the school library.
