### Being a Pupil Librarian will enable you to:

- \* Make a valuable contribution to the life of the school
- \* Help develop the library and the services it offers
- \* Help the library staff provide the best library service they can
- \* Make a difference to other pupils' learning
- \* Act as a role model for other pupils

#### You will also:

- \* Improve your communication and problem-solving skills
- \* Work well with others in a team
- \* Take responsibility
- \* Think on your feet

### As a Pupil Librarian you will enjoy special privileges including:

- \* First choice of new stock, which you can help to choose
- \* Access to the library prior to official opening before registrations and some intervals
- \* The chance to get involved in special events

# Finally...

You are able to work towards <u>Dynamic Youth</u> (P6 - S4) and <u>Youth Achievement Awards</u> (S3 onwards) which recognise and accredit your achievements. You, your peers and the Librarian will monitor record and evaluate the work you do in the library.

Pupils in S1 and 2 will prepare for Dynamic Youth Awards. Once you are in S3 and are 14yrs old, you can then work towards Youth Achievement Awards.

Youth Achievement Awards are available at four levels which give you a recognised qualification. You have to be 14yrs old or over. The role of Pupil Librarian would give you the opportunity to work at Bronze level in the first instance. Up to 30 hours of Dynamic Youth can count towards 2 challenges at Bronze level.

Bronze (taking part in peer group activities)

Four 15-hour Challenges - (General Standard Grade)

Silver (help to organise activities)

Six 15-hour Challenges - National 5 (Credit Standard Grade)

Gold (plan, organise and lead activities)

Seven 15-hour Challenges - Higher

Platinum (Leadership role)

135 hours participation - Advanced Higher

- Letting the librarian know when you can't attend
- Attending weekly meetings

#### Library Assistants will:

- be reliable
- hardworking
- honest
- cheerful
- sensible
- enthusiastic
- be able to work on their own or as a team.

#### You will also:

- have an interest in books
- understand alphabetical & numerical order or are prepared to learn
- enjoy thinking on your feet
- enjoy helping other people
- be prepared to attend any training sessions / meetings as required



Library Assistants will be encouraged to work towards their Dynamic Youth Award or Youth Achievement Awards which recognise for the work you do.
