
**Dive into this quick guide for  
successful understanding of  
how the library is arranged**

The system used in this library is called the **Dewey Decimal Classification System**. It is used in many libraries across the world. It is called a **decimal** system because it is divided into **ten** main subject areas.

Each book is given a number according to its subject. The number represents the **subject** of the book:

eg. Horses 636.1  
Football 796.334

This means that on the shelves, books are arranged in **NUMERICAL ORDER** according to their subject. Books about the same subject are kept in the same place on the shelves. Each book has a label on it showing its Dewey Number.



The number on the spine label tells us where the book is kept. There are different coloured labels for different parts of the library.

<b>RED</b>	=	<b>Reference Book</b>
<b>YELLOW</b>	=	<b>Orkney Book</b>
<b>WHITE</b>	=	<b>Non-fiction Book</b>
<b>ORANGE</b>	=	<b>Study Support</b>
<b>BLUE</b>	=	<b>Careers</b>

To help you find the right place on the shelves there are posters and shelf guides showing subject headings and the Dewey number.

The combination of the Dewey Number and the letters [and location letters] is called a **CALL NUMBER**. This is what you are looking for when you search the library catalogue on the computer.

The Call Number tells you the location of a book in the library eg. NF 638 DEA



## PASSPORT TO SUCCESS

*Something to help you understand Dewey Numbers*



Need help with your homework? The first group starting at 000 can help you. It includes **General Works** such as encyclopaedias, dictionaries, handbooks, etc. Other subjects covered here also include Computing and Journalism.

Feel like doing some serious thinking? The 100's contain books on subjects like **Philosophy**, Psychology and Information. Interested in the supernatural? - This is where you could find books about it.



200 is the starting point for books on **Religion**. All Religions are covered in this group, as are Beliefs and Mythologies.

Need to know about people? 300 is the **Social Sciences**. These are things like Politics, Law, Education, Transport. In other words books which deal with everyday life and the community.




**Language** books are grouped together from 400. You will find books on learning French and German here as well as other languages.

**500 Pure Science** Science includes books about Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and books about the earth, plants and animals.



**600 Technology or Applied Science** covers things like Medicine, Manufacturing, Building, Business and Cookery. Look here to find car maintenance, baking or farming.

Want to relax and have some fun, draw, paint, play music or play football? **700 is The Arts**. This is where books on Sport and Recreation are grouped.



With the thought of all these books you might want to read. The 800 group is **Literature**. Fancy a bit of poetry, essays, plays or even Shakespeare then come to this group.

Finally, the last group starting at 900 contains books on **Geography and History**. Think of it as 'the rest of the world'. Find out about the past, or how people lived.
