Reminders

- We expect children to be in school and ready to line up at 9.00am. If pupils are late they must report to office.
- You will appreciate teachers are busy first thing in the morning as they are preparing for class. Should you need to speak to them, a note in the school bag or on homework log is usually sufficient unless matter is urgent. They will endeavour to respond promptly. An appointment can be arranged through the school office.
- In the interest of pupil safety and easy access to school, please park considerately around school if you have to bring a car. We strongly encourage 'park and stride' as we did before.
- Children going by taxi should meet at the designated area with Mrs Messenger to ensure they get to taxi safely.
- Please keep bus & Taxi space clear for ease of access.
- Pupils bringing bikes, toys, mobiles to school do so at their own risk. We recommend bike locks to be used as before. Please remind children to wheel their bike in and out of the school gate.
- Lunches are £1.90. Where possible payment should be made on Monday for the week's lunches.

GYM KIT Reminder

It is very important that they have the appropriate kit:- shorts, t-shirt, socks and gym shoes in an appropriate gym bag. We also ask that shorts and t-shirts are a plain colour, preferably white tops and blue or black shorts. The children must have a change of shoes for health and safety reasons. Please note that jewellery should not be worn during PE and long hair should be tied back. Ear-rings should be removed or can be taped over. All PE and school clothing and footwear should be clearly labelled! Information on PE days will shortly be going out via the class teacher.



MEDICAL CONDITIONS

Should your child have a medical condition which may require essential treatment or emergency administration of medication, the following arrangements exist: (New guidance from NHS Tayside)

- A Parental Request form MUST be completed for either medication administration by staff or to be self-administered.
- This should be accompanied by a letter from a doctor detailing your child's condition, symptoms and treatment. The community Child Health Service (Doctor) can assist with this.
- The school will hold medication, under secure conditions, clearly marked for use for your child.
- Parents are responsible for handing it in to a member of staff. You should not send it in with your child. You are also responsible for ensuring we have up to date medication.
- Routine medication should be administered by parents at home. It will not be given during school hours.
- Any child who requires an inhaler must have 1 in school and 1 in their school bag as per NHS Tayside guidelines

Parents should ensure that their child's routine medication is prescribed in dose frequencies which enables it to be taken outwith school time (unless prescription states a specific time for medication to be administered for diagnostic purposes.

Incident reports



We have developed a form for sending to parents to highlight issues/incidents as they arise at school. This could be relating to a playground bump and to indicate what medical attention they received or it may be to inform you of unacceptable behaviour and to let you know the action taken. We ask for you to sign the form should you receive one and send back promptly with your child.
