Dear all.

Welcome back to school and I hope you are getting settled back into the routine of school. It has been lovely to see how confident and relaxed all our new pupils have been over the past two weeks.

We welcome Mrs Gillian Griffiths as P4-7 teacher and Mrs Harding as our RCCT teacher who will be in on a Wednesday working with P4-7 in the morning and P1-3 in the afternoon. We have also just appointed a new Pupil Support Assistant for 5 mornings for this session and I will let you know when the start date is agreed.

I would also like to extend a very warm welcome to our new families. All the staff look forward to working in partnership with all families to ensure our pupils experiences are of the highest quality we can provide.

Our first concern is always to keep our pupils safe and in the first week of the term both classes focussed on knowing what to do if you are concerned either for yourself or another pupil. There is a locked box that pupils can put their names into and staff check the box daily to ensure concerned pupils can speak to an adult they trust in the school. If any parent has concerns about any child please contact Mrs Gibson who is our Child Protection Officer, Mrs McIntosh or in an emergency the Child Protection Duty Team in Perth on **01738 476768**.

All the pupils have been extremely smart in their school uniform and would urge you to ensure that all items of clothing are marked in permanent marker to ensure we know who the various jumpers/PE kits, that get separated from their owners, belong to.

Restorative practices are used at Grandtully PS to support the highest level of respect and relationships between all members of our school community. When we do have issues pupils are expected to reflect on their action/words and identify the impact they have had, taking responsibility for them and work to address the damage caused (with adult support). This is usually an apology, offer to do/say something and a commitment to changing their actions in the future. Occasionally, when this is not effective, or where the incident is deemed significant or serious an appropriate sanction will be put in place. If there are repeated incidents we would seek to contact parents to work together to improve the behaviour/s. Staff are more than happy to provide more information about Restorative Approaches.

Please take time to look at the planners that staff have made in consultation with the pupils for their learning throughout the term. The areas for study and the skills the pupils are developing are highlighted to help you know what is happening in class. Homework will start next week with regular reading, spelling, maths work and a family learning project that the pupils will share at the end of term—more detail will be coming from Mrs Gibson and Mrs Griffiths.

We have a drop in every Monday from 3.20-3.50pm when you can come in and look in the class and chat to the teachers. If you would like to have a more formal discussion please make an appointment through the office or e-mail. Please note the office hours are 12.30-4pm Monday to Wednesday and 10.30-4pm on Thursday/Friday. I hope you will look at the webpage, blogs and twitter feeds that the class are posting to record the work they are doing over the next term.

l attach a draft year calendar. If there are any significant clashes please let me know by 1.9.17. As always your comments, suggestions and questions are welcome.

I hope to see you all at the introductory meeting on Thursday.

### Support to Become a Childminder in Perth & Kinross

Perth & Kinross Council's Childcare Strategy Team continues to work with people who are considering childminding as a career by running free introductory sessions and pre-registration training courses as well as offering start-up grants and ongoing support.

Morning and evening introductory sessions are being held on Wednesdays 30 August and 8 November. Pre-registration courses will be held in September and November, with the option of attending for two whole days or over four evenings. A crèche can be provided for daytime sessions and courses if required.

As part of the recent Early Learning and Childcare consultation, families in some parts of Perth & Kinross said they would use a local childminder - if only there was one available! The Childcare Strategy Team has also been told by a number of childminders that they are planning to close over the next few months. The team is, therefore, particularly keen to hear from people living in Aberfeldy, Birnam, Blair Atholl, Grandtully or Pitlochry who might be interested in childminding.
