Quality Improvement Plan

Talk4writing - teaching framework which has 5 steps

- 1. Start with cold task (without support)
- 2. Reviewed by teachers
- 3. Model picture format (like learning shorthand) Story maps based on repetition, pupils can visualise the text through pictures
- 4. Planning stage -focus on setting/ character, subheadings and paragraphs
- 5. Hot task (to see progression)

Nurture - looking to be accredited for being nurturing school

Looks at children's perceptions of themselves

Based on 6 points - re-evaluation by teachers

- 1 Children's learning understood through development
- 2 Classroom offers a safe base
 - 3 Importance of nurture for the development of wellbeing
- 4 Language is a vital means of communication
- 5 All behavior is communication
- 6 Importance of transition in children's lives

Just2Easy - new platform with multiple programmes and parents can see progress (like seesaw). Teachers will be trialing each programme - once established, will share with parents

Pupil Equity Fund

Funding used to close the gap -

Bigmaths (online subscription) targeted for each child

Nessy - online spelling programme - custom for children who have difficulty with writing/reading

Talk4writing - training for teachers (website available for more info)

Introduced jotters for writing (lined paper), kids are enjoying using these.

Fundraising for the year

Basil Death - ?1st March, applications from school or parent council

Fundraising - Thrift shop (requested for 2025, not date yet), Pub quiz - Thursday 27th March Craggs

Amazon wish list? Idea for school to start a Wishlist for parents to keep an eye on. However school is already requesting materials etc for PC to fund.

Tuck - Parent council pay for children's tuck toast and fruit - ?100 month

Lots of waste in the past when lots of options previously available for tuck especially in younger classes, most children happy with it. Jam/ honey/ marmalade - local donations to reduce costs?

Breaktime - main concern as Lauras hours have been reduced, she is not present on a Thursday or Friday to support at breaktimes. 5 hrs of Jades time is allocated to covering break time. Sheona is still in conversation with PKC re: funding for additional hours for Laura. Currently meet criteria in terms of staff to children ratio

Uniform - Constant struggle as kids are losing jumpers and fleeces, the school has a 'Relaxed uniform' - but it is felt that wearing a school jumper/fleece is expected and attempting to not lose these is promoting a good 'lifeskill'.

Yurt - Cannot be insured through the council. Discussion whether this is worth insuring, Red Kite to visit school, annual check on Yurt

Nits - Continuing outbreak, teachers are unable to send pupils home for treatment. Parents are encouraged to do regular checks and treatment.
