





Our achievements this year

- ▶ Not only have we increased writing attainment across the board but also children have reported increased motivation. Our survey showed an increase from 52% to 65% of our children now say they like writing.
- ▶ Nurture – we have implemented consistent universal approaches across the school. For example visual timetables, lanyards, use of language.
- ▶ Managed to implement Just2easy as a means of sharing learning with parents. We can see an increasing number of parents engaging with this.
- ▶ We have almost achieved our Silver Award for Rights Respecting School
- ▶ Increased and improved Family Partnership working at Grandtully Primary – Ciara to update
- ▶ Increase in attendance from 92.7%- 94.36% stretch aim is 96%

Family Partnership Working at Grandtully Primary 2024-25

Working with families and the community is a central part of our ethos at Grandtully. We want to work with families and set up events that will help give an insight into learning at Grandtully, share skills and showcase pupil learning.

So far this year we have held **2 curriculum events, 7 family learning sessions** and **3 showcase events**

Family Learning Bird Watch – 21%

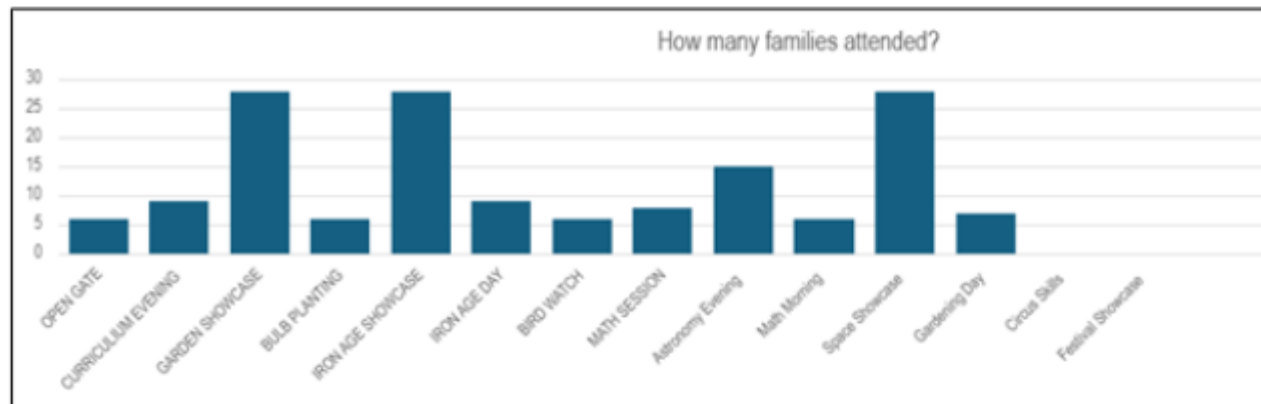

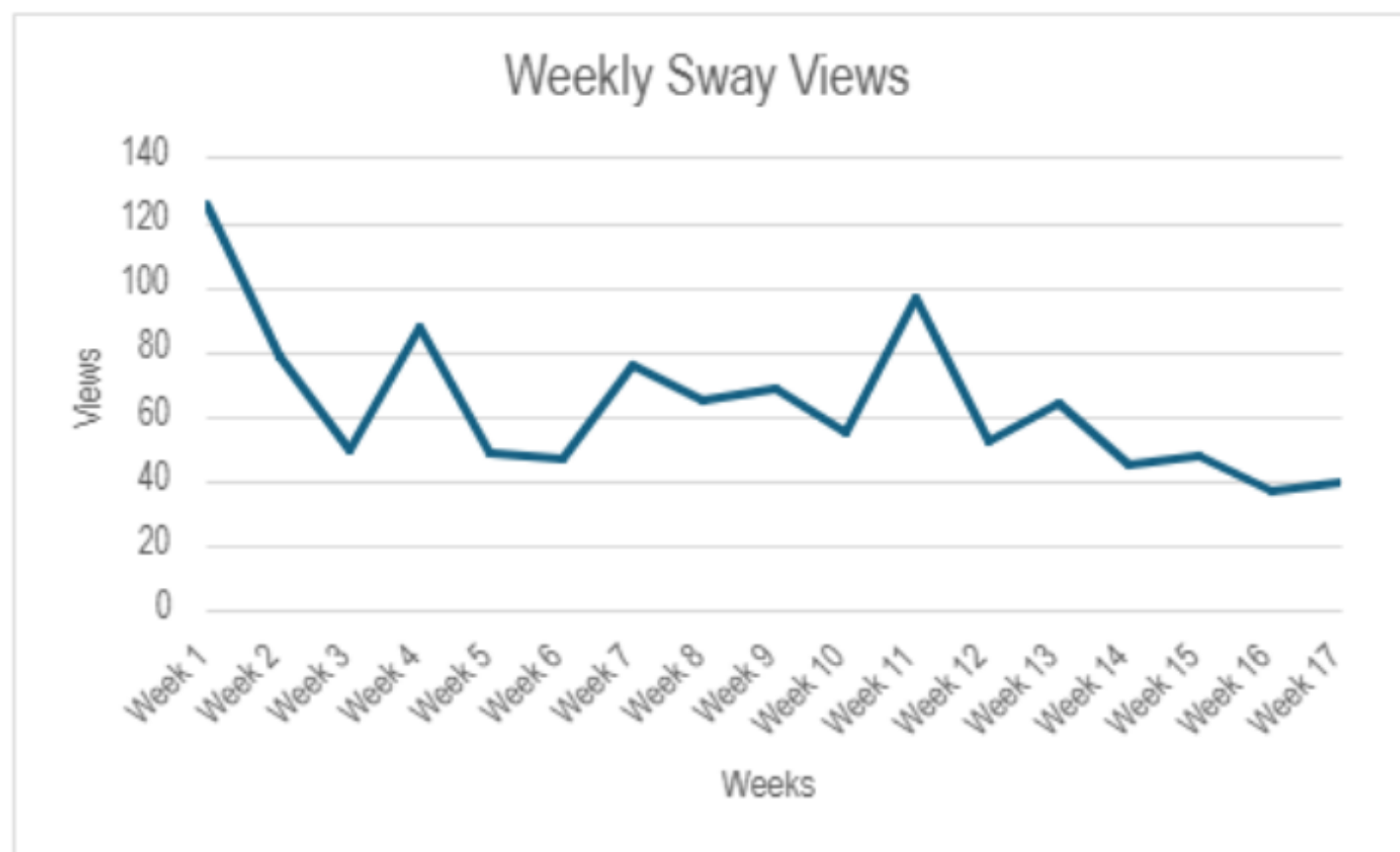

Family Partnership Working at Grandtully Primary 2024-25

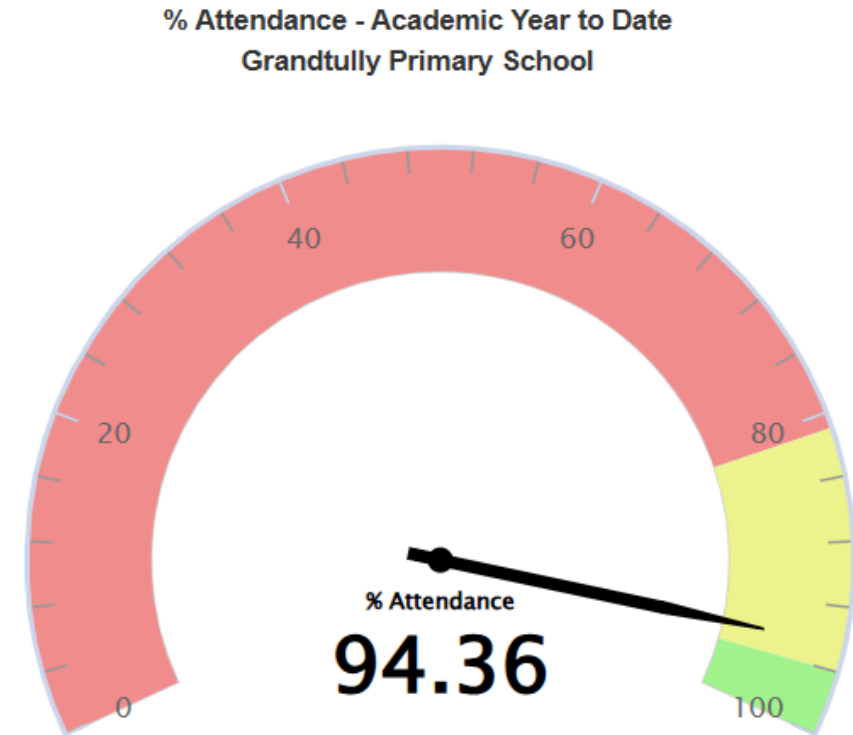

UNIFORM

- Easily accessible colours

- All resources required for learning supplied by the school
- Items for specific projects donated or sourced through funding opportunities
- Resources always available for homework tasks



MEALS & SNACKS

- Universal free school meals for P1-5
- All children provided with free snack funded by Parent Council
- Free water bottles provided for all children
- Cooking & baking resources provided by school



HEALTH & WELLBEING

- Free toothbrushes and toothpaste provided to P1
- Free sanitary products provided



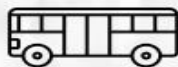
FUNDRAISING & THEMED DAYS

- School fundraising kept to a minimum
- Work with PC to ensure their fundraising is spread throughout the year
- School Showcases all free to attend
 - Costumes for shows etc made in school or encouraged to upcycle



CLUBS & ACTIVITIES

- Active Schools provide free taster sessions/blocks within school
- Lunch time clubs are free of charge



TRIPS

- Staff access local area within walking distance
- Use of free or cheaper public transport where possible
- All trips are free to access, funded by Parent Council and grants



DIGITAL ACCESS

- Small loan-bank of IT devices available to support learning at home

Annual excursions transport

- Rugby Festival - parents

We want all our pupils to experience the opportunities the outdoors offers them living here

- P4 – Camserney gardens free except for transport

Total request

- Transport – £2000
- Admission to a cultural experience – £360
- Outdoor activities – £2500 per year including a ski residential in 2027 with Kenmore and potentially £2000 to go towards the ski trip in the following year.
- Overnight to Edinburgh – approx. £120 per child £1000
- Miscellaneous - £200
- Total £6060 however we can try and source funding.
