


Newsletter – January 2025

George Thompson Memorial Event

Four of our House Captains attended the memorial at Loch Leven Community Campus to mark the 80th anniversary of the death of George Thompson V.C.- a former pupil of both Portmoak and Kinross High School, who was awarded the Victoria Cross for his gallantry during the Second World War.

The children did an excellent job of representing the school and I have had lovely feedback about their respectful conduct during the event. They will be preparing their own presentation to share with the rest of our pupils in the near future.



Eco Schools Update

This year, our Eco committees are working towards renewing our Green Flag status. The topics the committees have been focussing on are Climate Change, Biodiversity and Energy.

Both committees have been busy learning about these topics, that healthy biodiversity supports healthy ecosystems which make life possible and that we can support biodiversity by encouraging wildlife and habitats, supporting conservation and connecting to nature through our senses.

They have also been learning that energy is something we all use every day and it comes from a variety of sources: fossil fuels, nuclear, wind, solar and tidal, that global energy consumption is increasing overall, but not everyone has equal access to energy in various parts of the world.

However, to receive our next Green Flag, it is important that the whole school have an understanding of what these topics mean. To achieve this, every class will be taking part in activities linked to Biodiversity and Energy. Our Biodiversity week will be w/c 24th March and Energy week will be w/c 31st March.

We have already welcomed some of our new P1s to school to see their classroom and are so looking forward to them starting school! Please ring the office and make an appointment to come in if you have not already done so.


